#### REED IS ALL-DISTRICT AT CEDARVILLE

Mark Reed, a freshman from Mt. Sidney, wrapped up an outstanding year as a member of the Cedarville (OH) College golf team. He recently became only the third player from the school to land a spot on the All-NAIA District 22 team during his rookie season. Mark is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Reed.

Reed was one of six players to make the all-district unit after firing rounds of 78-75 for a 153 total which was seven shots behind the medalist. He ended the year as the only Yellow Jacket to carry an 18-hole average in the 70's as his was 77.9 while playing in the team's number one position. Reed failed to break 80 in only four out of 15 rounds this spring.

Mark is the second Reed from Cedarville to earn all-district honors. His older brother Mike, who graduated last year, made the group during the 1983 and 1984 campaigns.

Much will be expected from the younger Reed in the near future. He will be the only player from this year's top six that will not be lost through graduation.
