Re: ALL-MID-OHIO CONFERENCE SOCCER TEAM ANNOUNCED

The 1972 All-Mid-Ohio Conference soccer team has been announced, and players from Cedarville College and Urbana College dominate the selections. Cedarville and Urbana both placed four men on the squad, and Malone College followed with three. Ohio Dominican and Rio Grande did not place anyone on the eleven-man unit.

The linemen include Larry Bollback, from Cedarville, Harry Mansmann, Terry Clarke, and Lee Schreiner, all from Urbana, and Malone's George Hionides. Bollback led Cedarville's NAIA champion squad, scoring fourteen goals and tallying ten assists, for twenty-four points. Mansmann topped Urbana scorers, ten goals scored and two assists, for twelve points. Schreiner followed with nine points, and Clarke six. Hionides, from Malone, scored three goals and racked up two assists.

The All-MOC backfield consists of Cedarville's Phil McMillen and Tom Farlow, Malone's Bill Clary and Guy Hull, and Urbana's Pete Kerch. McMillen scored three points, Farlow two, Clary none, Hull four, and Kerch none.

Goalie for the first team unit is Cedarville's Terry Holley, who yielded only twenty goals in thirteen Yellow Jacket games. Holley's average was only 1.5 goals against per game.

Seven players were named to the Honorable Mention unit. They are: Steve Spink (Cedarville), Barry Inketic (Cedarville), Russ Berry (Malone), Frank Yoder (Malone), Dave Kuhn (Malone), Mike Castor (Urbana), and Larry Rouse (Urbana).

Cedarville won the Mid-Ohio Conference soccer crown for the second straight year. Coach Paul Berry's Yellow Jackets topped the conference standings with a 2-0 record. Urbana finished in second, at 1-1, and Malone had a 0-2 mark. Ohio Dominican and Rio Grande, the MOC's other two members, did not compete.
