Football - Most Valuable player for Taylor University; 1952-53 and
1954-55 seasons; All-Hoosier Conference 1954-55; All-
State 1954, 1955; Second in scoring in Indiana with
85 points; Third in scoring in Nations Small Colleges
1954-55; Led state in rushing with 8.1 yards per carry;
Set Taylor's scoring records in 1954 with 86 points;
Approached by Los Angeles Rams of the National Football
League.

Track - Earned 4 letters; ran 100, 220, and broad jumped;

Basketball - Earned several high school honors; played with two
