Two remarkable things about these playoffs are that the home field advantage was not very obvious and that none of the games was a cliffhanger

Cedarville looked very good in their title win. They led 2-0 after about 30 minutes of the first half. A potential turning point for Spring Arbor went svry later in the half when they blew a penalty kick - twice. The first kick went wide, but Cedarville goalie Dave Slusher moved his feet too soon, and a second kick was awarded. The second one went right to Slusher, and he gathered it in. Cedarville iced it in the second half when their outstanding midfielder, Evandro Batista, powered in a free kick from about 30 yards out which grazed a defender's head and wound up in the net.
