#### YELLOW JACKET CROSS COUNTRY

This past Saturday, both the men's and women's cross country teams completed probably their best performances of the season thus far. Both teams were victorious in the NCCAA District III Meet at Asbury College in Wilmore, Kentucky.



The women won their first meet ever with a score of 37 points,

barely outdistancing Grace College's 39 and Asbury College's 44.

Freshman, Sue Vaughan won the meet with a time of 22:02 over the

5000 meter course, and Terri Schmidt's 22:24 earned third place.

Carla Marling, Rhonda Coventry, and Debbie Richardson completed the scoring with times of 23:45, 25:45, and 26:22 to take 5, 13 and 15 respectively.

The men's team was rather impressive in their victory with a big point spread over their nearest opponents. The Yellow Jackets tallied 34 point to second place Spring Arbor's 73. Grace College and Marion College tied for third with 74.

Individually it was Freshman, Tom Hill leading the way again with a time of 26:32 for a third place finish. Gary Anderson's time of 27:02 was good enough for fifth place. Craig Slater and Dan Bisbee turned in great efforts with times of 27:11 and 27:31 to take seventh and eighth respectively. Dave Schumaker rounded out the scoring with an 11th place finish at 27:54.

Coach Elvin King was pleasantly surprised with the victories and termed the men's victory a mild upset. Marion had beaten the men by 20 points in a meet earlier this season. Coach King pointed out the efforts of Slater and Bisbee as a key to the win and he called Bisbee's "his best race in 3 years at Cedarville." Coach King is looking for one of the highest finishes in recent years for the harriers at the All-Ohio Meet this Friday at Ohio Wesleyan.

#### VOLLEYBALL TEAM POSTS FIRST VICTORY

The volleyball team defeated Denison College in a best of five series. The match was hard fought and lasted the full five games.

Superb net-play by Peg Quigley and Karen Hobar determined the outcome of the match. The women also hosted a tri-match, in which they lost to Defiance College 14-16 and 5-15. They also lost to Muskingum 10-15 and 11-15. Beth Goldsmith and Renee Gaston, two outstanding freshman, have shown their talents and should be seeing more playing time as the season progresses.

Each match has shown steady improvement moving more and more towards a consistent form. Despite their 1-8 record to date, the potential is there as well as the talent to have a good overall season.

The Yellow Jackets will have the entire varsity squad in tact for
the first time in over a month as they head into the Homecoming game
with Asbury College Saturday. The kickers have had at least seven players

on the injured or lame list in recent weeks. "Only time will tell if the team will finish the season strong. The potential is there, if we can only stay healthy and play consistently with intensity" states coach John McGillivray.
