ASHLEY SHORT RECEIVES TYLENOL FUTURE CARE SCHOLARSHIP

Cedarville, Ohio--Ashley Short, a junior nursing student minoring in cross-cultural nursing, is one of 40 recipients of the Tylenol Future Care Scholarship out of over 25,000 students who applied.

The Tylenol Scholarship Program began in 1982, awarding scholarships to undergraduate and graduate students pursuing an education in health care.

Short attributes receiving the scholarship to God. “It’s all God that I got the scholarship. He has directed this scholarship and is the only way I can explain receiving it.”

God has always provided for Short financially. She said that The Tylenol Scholarship is proof of His faithfulness as it will help to relieve financial pressure. “God is the reason that I’m here at Cedarville and have all the opportunities I have,” she said.
