CEDARVILLE, OHIO -- Fifty-one men's and women's cross country participants have been named Academic All-America by the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), two of which are from Cedarville College. Beth McGillivray and John Oswald earned selection in recognition for excellence in competition and in the classroom.

McGillivray, who is a senior from Cedarville, carries a 3.919 grade point average as an English major. She is a three-year letter winner as a member of the Lady Jacket cross country program. Beth was named to the NAIA's Academic All-America track team in the spring and she is a two-time national high jump champion in the National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA).

Oswald is a junior Business Administration major from Three Rivers, Mich. who currently has a 3.627 GPA. John is a three-time NCCAA cross country All-American and a two-year letter winner at Cedarville. He transferred from Grand Rapids Baptist College in the fall of 1985 and has since been the Yellow Jackets number three runner.
