## MINISTRY TOOLS FOR THE 21ST CENTURY

Brandt Gustavson, president of the National Religious Broadcasters, recently stated, "Technology is changing at

breakneck speed in the world of broadcasting and communications in general. I encourage all Christian broadcasters to do all they can to keep up with technology in an everchanging world. We ought to be praying, 'Lord, keep us up to date and flexible'—always remembering the message!"

many listeners As remember, the CDR Radio Network Center received a direct hit by lightning in July of 1994. operations center was significantly Our main computer damaged. automation system and much of the related broadcasting equipment was rendered inoperable. We had planned on upgrading our facilities to the digital standard over the next three years but God had moved our timetable up considerably!

We received an insurance settlement which helped us purchase state-of-the-art digital operating and recording equipment. This was a timely improvement. However, having a digital studio and enabling listeners to benefit from it involved an upgraded distribution system. Consequently,

the UPLINK '95 capital project followed. Thanks to the generosity of listeners from all CDR Radio Network service

areas, the project reached the goal of \$70,000 in time for installation in the fall of 1996.

We're now beginning to experience the benefits of the integrated digital operating environment. Let me explain one of the features and how it effects our daily operations. Our operating systems include what is known as a Digital

Longform Recorder (DLR). Over the past year, many of the broadcasts you enjoy are sent to us by satellite. The DLR system enables us to "capture" the program or newscast and store it for retrieval and rebroadcast at a later time. This has turned out to be a crucial tool with approximately 440 different events being captured and recorded each week!

The technology upgrades were essential to position CDR for future ministry in the digital realm. We are already appreciating the versatility of the digital systems as they interface with our daily Chapel broadcast from the new Dixon Ministry Center. Future uses include such possibilities as programming on the digital broadcasting spectrum (an alternative to traditional AM and FM broadcasting). Another exciting possibility involves the use of RDS (Radio Data System) receivers. Listeners would receive digital information such as song titles, weather bulletins, or Scripture portions on their display units. What a unique way to communicate with a large number of people!

The mission of the CDR Radio Network is to "Help listeners understand the Word of God and their world in light

Soloist Ray Boltz says it well in his popular song, "Thank you for giving to the Lord, I am a life that was changed." Your partnership with CDR Radio is changing lives for eternity.

The technical improvements at The CDR Radio Network Center and other Cedarville College facilities have greatly enhanced the quality and reliability for listeners. Some of the new resources include:

- Digital operating and production equipment
- Satellite uplink and downlink equipment (6 sites)
- 10 CD music units
- 5,500 watt Generator System (CDR Radio Network Center)
- Two SAW Editors for digital production
- AP Newswire software
- De-icing units for satellite downlinks (6 sites)
- New broadcast console and editing station in The Dixon Ministry Center
- CedarNet, the award-winning computer network of Cedarville College

The installation for most of the equipment was accomplished by the CDR Radio staff, thereby saving thousands of dollars in the process.
