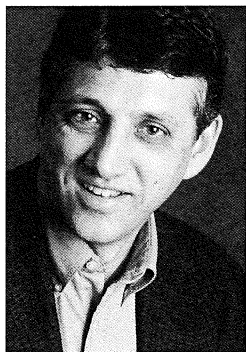

Born in upstate New York, Paul Kenyon earned the Doctor of Musical Arts in piano performance from Michigan State University where he studied piano with Deborah Moriarty and Ralph Votapek. Dr. Kenyon also holds degrees from Mansfield University and Bowling Green State University, with additional studies at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto. His principal teachers have included Jerome Rose and Angeline Schmid. For six summers, Dr. Kenyon performed at the Colby Piano

Institute in Waterville, Maine, where he coached with the internationally renowned pianist, Anthony di Bonaventura.

Paul Kenyon is a member of the music faculty at Point Loma Nazarene University where he has taught piano since 1991, and now serves as chair of the music department. He is also the founding director of the Point Loma Keyboard Institute that serves as intensive summer experience for teenaged piano students. In addition, Dr. Kenyon serves as director of worship ministries at Reformation Lutheran Church in El Cajon, California. Before moving to San Diego, Dr. Kenyon taught piano at Western Michigan University and Wright State University.



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
