Al Knott, Cedarville's All-American candidate finished a brilliant four year career in which he scored over 2,000 points. He finished fourth in this years MOC scoring race with a21.7 average, fourth in rebounds with a 11.4 average, and fourth in free throws percentage at 77.6. Al is an all-MOC choice for the third time.

Jerry Carder, also completes a brilliant four year earoor in which he fell just shy of the 2,000 point mark. Jerry battled for the league scoring lead all year and finished second at 23.9, while leading in field goal percentage at 54.3. An NAIA All American selection last year, this is Findley's first year in the MOC, and thus Jerry's first All-MOC honor.

Dan Terhune was the only player selected twice as player of the week. Leading his team with a 19.3 average and seventh in the MOC, Dan scored many key baskets to lead Deliance to a 21-5 record.

dim Corder and 1967 NAIA All sucrican selection made his first appearance on the All MOC team as Findley just began MOC competition this year. Finishing third in the MOC scoring race with a 22.9 average, Jim surpassed the 2,000 point career neck to set a new Oiler record. Jim finished fourth in MOC field goal percentage at 52.1 and fourth in assists with 3.4 per game.

dim Sommer, a rugged renunder led the league with 12.8 grabs a game. Jim also averaged 17.4 joints per game to finish ten in league scoring. The Bruffton Senior has previously made the 1967 All MOC Football team as an end to be the only player to receive both honors.
