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Articles of Incorporation.

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The undersigned James F. Morton, Hugh H. McMillan, Thomas Gibson, Hugh McCallum Jr. and Richard Park, citizens of the State of Ohio, hereby associate themselves to become a body corporate, in accordance with the laws of said State under the following articles

(1) The name of the said corporation shall be "The Cedarville College"

(2) Said corporation shall be located and its principal business transacted at Cedarville Green County, State of Ohio.

(3) The object of said corporation is not profit, but to secure to its members and patrons the advantages of education in all departments of learning and knowledge and especially education according to the rules and discipline of "The Reformed Presbyterian Church in North America, to promote the interests of said church and to receive and hold donations and bequests and funds arising from other sources for the benefit of said corporation. Said corporation is to be under the control of the General Synod of said church.

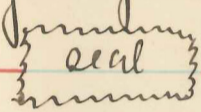
