1990 Season Outlook

Cedarville College volleyball coach **ELAINE BROWN** is expecting her team to reach new heights in 1990 -- both figuratively and literally. She is counting on her tallest team ever to continue a winning tradition that has posted two straight record-setting seasons.

"We are counting on a stronger offensive attack," said Brown, who is 182-134 in eight years at Cedarville. "I'm hoping that the height will translate into better blocking as well. This team has the talent to be even better than the last two I've had."

The Yellow Jackets set a school record for victories during last year's 34-13 campaign and were seeded #2 in the NAIA District 22 playoffs. That effort topped the 31-13 mark set by the 1988 club.

Only two starters, junior all-around **LORI HAMILTON** and sophomore hitter **TRACIE BURLINGAME**, return to the line-up. They are two of three players who played in all 47 matches in 1989.

Senior back row specialist **LINDA BEAN** and sophomore hitter **DEE HAUSER** saw considerable action last year. Sophomore **DEB HENRY** may play the most important role as the team's primary setter.

HEAD VOLLEYBALL COACH



Coach Elaine Brown begins her ninth year at the helm of the Cedarville volleyball program. Her teams have posted a 182-134 record under her leadership for a .576 winning percentage. Last year, she led the Lady Jackets to a best-ever 34-13 record and a berth in the NAIA District 22 playoffs. Brown was named the Western Buckeye Collegiate Conference Coach of the Year after her team won its first ever WBCC title. Elaine, who is single and resides in Cedarville, is a 1977 graduate of Cedarville College and is presently pursuing a doctoral degree at Ohio State University.

LINDA BEAN, 5-7 SENIOR BACK ROW WEST CHICAGO, IL

Bean earned a letter last year during her first season in the volleyball program. She played in 46 of 47 matches and specializes in back row play. Her 49 service aces and 0.43 SA/game ranked second on the team. Linda is a Physical Education major and was the team's Scholar-Athlete recipient last year. She was also a member of the Dean's List and an Alumni Scholarship Award winner.

TRACIE BURLINGAME, 5-8 SOPHOMORE HITTER MORGANTON, NC

Burlingame was recognized as last year's most valuable blocker after leading the team in that category as a freshman. She appeared in all 47 matches and averaged 1.91 kills and 0.46 blocks per game. Her top match at the net was 12 kills in 20 attempts versus Central State. Burlingame played under her father, Richard, at Wilson Christian Academy in North Carolina and was named to the all-state team.

SHAWN BUSH, 5-7 FRESHMAN SETTER/HITTER GALLIPOLIS, OH

Bush earned four letters in volleyball and softball at Gallia Academy. She was a District 13 All-Star in volleyball her senior season. Shawn intends on being a physical therapist and will major in Biology while at Cedarville.

LYNETTE CRUZ, 5-2 SOPHOMORE SETTER COUDERSPORT, PA

Cruz earned a letter last season as a freshman and was presented the team's Spirit Award. She was a member of the Lady Jacket tennis team that played at the NAIA national tournament. Cruz helped lead Coudersport Area High School to three straight Northern Tier League championships. Lynette, whose parents are involved in the medical profession, is a nursing major.

JENNIFER DILLING, 5-7 FRESHMAN HITTER RED LION, PA

Dilling earned one letter in volleyball while a member of the team at Red Lion High School in Pennsylvania. Her interests include singing, playing the piano, and drama, and she intends on being a music major at Cedarville. Jennifer was a member of the National Honor Society.

AMY DIRR, 6-1 SOPHOMORE HITTER HANLER, OH

Dirr joins the program as the tallest player that Brown has ever had. She spent last year at the Word of Life Bible Institute in Schroon Lake, N.Y. Amy earned two letters in volleyball at Patrick Henry H.S. and was a member of the National Honor Society.

LORI HAMILTON, 5-4 JUNIOR ALL-AROUND ROCHESTER, NY

Hamilton attempts to make a comeback after being involved in a serious auto accident last winter. She appeared in all 47 matches last season and her versatility is critical to the team. Lori averaged 2.58 kills, 3.91 assists, and 2.20 digs per game. Her top outing came against Indiana Wesleyan when she hammered 15 kills in 17 attempts. Hamilton owns two letters and was Cedarville's most improved player in '88.

ANGELA HARTMAN, 5-4 FRESHMAN SETTER LEO, IN

Hartman earned seven letters in volleyball and tennis while attending Leo High School. She was a part of two conference championship volleyball teams and one Sectional champion. Angela intends on being a nursing major.

DEE HAUSER, 5-5 SOPHOMORE HITTER GRIDLEY, IL

Hauser played in 45 of 47 matches last year as a rookie, mainly on the front row, and was tabbed the team's most improved player. Dee is a nursing major and was a member of the Dean's List. Hauser was named the most valuable volleyball player at Gridley High School where she was a first-team all-conference selection. She was a three-year letterwinner, Senior class president, and was salutatorian of her graduating class.

DEBBIE HENRY, 5-4 SOPHOMORE SETTER PERRYVILLE, OH

Henry is expected to assume the role as primary setter despite appearing in only 29 matches as a freshman last year. Debbie, who was a letterwinner in '89, earned three letters in volleyball at Lenawee Christian in Michigan. She was named to the all-county team and holds school records for service aces and assists. Henry was a three-time class president and the valedictorian of her class.

RACHEL SELLERS, 6-0 SOPHOMORE HITTER HILLIARD, OH

Sellers is expected to provide immediate help on the front line after transferring in from Liberty University. She twice led Hilliard High School in both blocks and kills during the same season. Rachel is a marketing major and intends on pursuing a career as a marketing analyst.

KRISTI VANDYKE, 5-9 FRESHMAN HITTER ELBING, KS

VanDyke earned nine letters in volleyball, basketball, and track at Berean Academy in Elbing, Kan. She holds a school record in the high jump and competed at the state level in the event all four years in high school. Kristi was also a member of the National Honor Society.

AMY ZEHR, 5-9 SOPHOMORE HITTER FT. WAYNE, IN

Zehr joins the volleyball program after playing for the Lady Jacket basketball team last year. She averaged 5.5 points and 4.9 rebounds per game on the hardwood. She earned 12 letters in volleyball, basketball, and softball while at Blackhawk Christian High School.
