BIOGRAPHIES

Violinist Jun Kim, Assistant Professor of Music at Cedarville University has performed extensively in Europe, Asia and North America. He has been invited to give violin master classes and performances at the universities in Korea and served as juries for many competitions. Kim has won prizes and awards including the Starling Competition, the CCM Concerto Competition, CIBC Canada National Music Competition, Vancouver Youth Symphony Concerto Competition, Tuesday Musical Competition of Akron and he was a recipient of the Aspen Music Festival Fellowship, British Columbia Cultural Scholarship, Bowdoin Festival fellowship, among others. He has also played in violin master classes of Cho-liang Lin, Pamela Frank, Federico Agostini, Sergiu Schwartz. An avid chamber musician, Mr. Kim has worked with the members of the Juilliard Quartet, Cleveland Quartet, La Salle Quartet, Tokyo String Quartet, and the Peabody Trio. Jun Kim is a founding member of The Ainos Trio and they performed at the opening concert of inaugural CCM Spoleto Festival in Spoleto, Italy. Professor Kim holds degrees from Peabody Conservatory, Indiana University and College Conservatory of Music at University of Cincinnati.

Dr. You-Seong Kim has performed throughout the United States, Canada, Germany, Portugal, Belgium, and her native Korea. She has appeared with the Kentucky Symphony, Cincinnati Opera, Hickory Choral Society, Bloomington Early Music Festival, Korean National Opera Studio, University of Cincinnati Opera and Indiana University Opera Theater. Among the operatic roles she has performed are Alcina, Pamina, Ilia, Despina, Susanna, Sinaide, and Suor Genovieffa. Her concert performances include the soprano solo in Bach B-minor Mass, Mozart Requiem, Brahms German Requiem, Poulenc Gloria, and Orff Carmina Burana to name a few. You-Seong Kim has been a winner at the prestigious German Art Song Competition, Internationaler Wettbewerb fuer Liederkunst in Stuttgart and her CD of Hans Eisler Lieder was released by Hugo Wolf Akademie in Stuttgart in 2005. She earned her doctoral degree from University of Cincinnati after she received Bachelors and Masters degrees in vocal performance from Seoul National University in Seoul, Korea. Dr. Kim has been teaching at Ohio University as a voice faculty since 2004, and also serves as a co-chair of Voice division.

Pianist **Ji Young Lee** is a D.M.A. Candidate at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music and works as a collaborative pianist in the Starling Preparatory String Project. She earned her Master of Music degree from the Eastman School of Music and her Bachelor's degree from Ehwa Womans University in Korea. Ji Young was the 2006 piano concerto competition winner at CCM and performed Chopin's Piano Concerto No. 2 at CCM. In 2009, she won the first prize at the American Protégé international competition and gave a concert on Chopin No. 2 at Weill recital hall at Carnegie Hall. Ji Young has given numerous solo and chamber music recitals in Europe and the United States.
