### REEP NAMED MVP

Basketball on all levels is coming to an end as everyone looks to the spring excitement. Cedarville brought all things to a conclusion with the Annual Basketball Banquet.

With a record of 12-13, the Yellow Jackets were led statistically by Steve Lones with an 18 scoring average, a 9.4 rebound average, and a free throw percentage of 68. Steve also gathered in All MOC honors as a 2nd team member and received honorable mention in the NAIA District 22. Capt. Jeff Reep was named MVP of the team and was once again chosen as the team captain for 1977-78. Jeff scored at a 17.0 average and rebound at a 7.3 average. He also received All MOC honors on the 2nd team and honorable mention in the NAIA District 22. Statistically, Jeff led the team in field shooting with a new school record of 55.9%.

Leaving the squad will be Don Smith, who for three years contributed greatly to the Yellow Jackets team. He compiled an average of 13.4 points and 7.9 rebounds during his time here at Cedarville College. Also graduating will be Rock Thacker after four hard worked years. He helped the team many times off of the bench.

With only two lettermen leaving Cedarville looks to have a strong team to match the tough schedule of next year's season.
