1987 Season Outlook:

Cedarville College returns just seven lettermen from last year's 14-18-1 baseball club, plus only 13 players are on the roster. But third-year coach Dan Coomes has been successful despite the small line-ups. His 1985 team finished with an 18-11 record as the NAIA District 22 runner-up and that club had 13 members. Pitching will be the Yellow Jackets strength led by junior righthander Dan Erlandson. Senior captain Danny Olinger (.341) will lead the offense and should receive help from juniors Ken Horton (.338) and Brian Marburger (.314). Coomes will be forced to move several veteran players to unfamiliar positions to fill gaps up the middle defensively. The one newcomer to have the quickest impact will be righthanded pitcher Steve Hester whose fastball has been clocked around 90 mph.
