CEDARVILLE, OHIO --- As the 1981 soccer season winds down, the Yellow Jackets of Cedarville College are gearing up for the NCCAA District III Tournament to be hosted by Cedarville on Friday and Saturday, November 13 and 14. Based on the Longo rating system, the kickers of Cedarville received the number one seed and the home field advantage. Grand Rapids Baptist College of Grand Rapids, Michigan; Bethel College of Mishawaka, Indiana; and Grace College of Winona Lake, Indiana are the number two, three and four seeded teams respectively in the district finals.

Grand Rapids Baptist College comes into the tournament with a 12-4-1 record of the season, and will square off against 12-5-1 Bethel College at 12:30 p.m. on Friday in the opening round. At 3:00 p.m. the same day, the Yellow Jackets (now 9-6-1) face the 8-11-1 Grace College squad. The championship game will be at 1:00 p.m. Saturday, November 14.

The winner of the District III Tournament will be one of the final four teams who will be meeting near Orlando, Florida for the NCCAA National Tournament to be held December 4 and 5. Coach John McGillivray is excited about the home advantage and the prospect of a NCCAA Nationals birth.
