WALSH WINS WOMEN'S DISTRICT TRACK MEET

Walsh College used good team balance to win the NAIA District 22 women's track meet at Rio Grande College on Saturday. The Cavaliers, who won only four of the 14 events, totaled 136 points and were followed by Central State with 93, Malone 79, Defiance 54, Cedarville and Findlay 36 apiece, Rio Grande 33, Bluffton 10, and Wilmington 2.

Cedarville captured only one first-place finish as junior Jane Romig coasted to an easy victory in the 800 meter dash in 2:14.0. That clocking was a new school record and she is currently one of the top three runners in the NAIA in the 800. Romig won the district race by 12 seconds.

Coach John McGillivray sacrificed some points as talented sprinter Esther Mahr was unable to make the trip and Romig only competed in the 800 meters. Sue Vaughan was the only other Lady Jacket to place as high as third and she achieved that in the 5000 with a time of 19:23.

Romig will definitely be going to the NAIA Nationals later on this month. McGillivray will be announcing his other entrants at a later date.
