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Centennial Library Cedarville University Annual Report 2002/2003

Major Accomplishments, 2002/2003

1. Library collection reached 150,000 print volumes

In June, 2002, the Centennial Library print collection reached 150,000 volumes. In honor of that event, a rare 17th-century Geneva Bible was purchased and processed into the collection as print volume number 150,000. This small quarto edition of the Bible was published by Robert Barker in London in 1608. The first edition of the Geneva (also known as the Breeches) Bible was published in 1560 in Europe, after many of the English reformationists fled to Geneva because public reading of the Bible had been prohibited in England. This version was read by Shakespeare and Bunyan and was of cardinal importance for its influence on the English language, literature, and thought. The Geneva Bible was also the Bible of the Puritans and the Pilgrims. The edition purchased for the Centennial Library, with an attractive 19th century binding, also has bound within it two concordances, a 1609 Psalter, and a 1608 Common Book of Prayer.

2. Curriculum Materials Center Librarian position filled

On August 1st, Greg Martin officially joined the Library faculty as the new Curriculum Materials Center Librarian. Greg came to Cedarville after 30 years in public school education, the last 16 years as the Media Specialist at Central Middle School in Xenia, Ohio.

3. Assistant Director for Media Services received a research grant

Carl Brandon, Assistant Director for Media Resources was selected to receive the 2002 John Kerstetter Research Award from the Consortium of College and University Media Centers. The award, in the amount of \$2,000, was provided to support Carl's proposal to study institutions that effectively integrate technology with the development of faculty presentation skills. His project should be completed in 2003 and will likely be the subject of a presentation at the CCUMC national conference and an article in their journal, <u>College and University Media Review: A Look at Practices, Trends & Research</u>.

4. User Education Librarian had a journal article published

A journal article, written by Rory Patterson, *User Education Librarian*, was included in the <u>Reference Services Review</u> (vol. 29, no.3, 2001), published

by MCB University Press. The article entitled "Live Virtual Reference: More Work and More Opportunity" was written while Rory was the Reference Librarian at the U.S. Department of Energy Library in Germantown, Maryland. The article reviews the virtual reference desk program at that library which provided live reference service via the Internet using chat, referring the patrons to or sending them to Web pages, collaborating on reference questions, and providing transcripts for patron follow-up.

5. Second AV Technician approved for 2003/2004

Given the challenge in the current environment of obtaining the approval for additional staff positions, the approval of a second AV Technician for 2003/2004 was a significant accomplishment during the current year. This need was occasioned by an increased demand for technical support to maintain current tech classrooms–now more than 60, growing equipment installation activity, additional on-site technology equipment maintenance and repair, and the annual upgrading of tech classrooms. Recently, an additional burden was created by the opening of new classrooms in the remodeled Athletic Center, and soon, added academic facilities will be coming on-line in the new Fitness/Recreation/Health Center. This new position was filled during July, 2003.

6. Three Library faculty members promoted

For the first time in the history of the Library, three Library faculty members were promoted during the same year. Carl Brandon, Assistant Library Director for Media Services, was promoted from Assistant to Associate Professor. Tonya Fawcett, Assistant Library Director for Reader Services, and Susan Winn, Reference Librarian, were promoted from Instructor to Assistant Professor.

7. Second Scholarship Award in Library Science Presented

For the second time since the award was established, the Centennial Library Scholarship Award in Library Science was awarded to a graduating senior. This award was established by the Centennial Library faculty to encourage and actively support the next generation of library and information specialists, and especially to encourage those who will fill the future library faculty ranks of Christian colleges and universities. The cash award is available to senior applicants, and is made directly to the institution in which the recipient is enrolled for graduate study in Library and information science. The first award was presented in 2000, and now Catherine Thorne, an Integrated Language Arts major, has received the second. She plans on attending the University of Kentucky graduate school during the Fall of 2003.

8. Library Upgrade Phase 2 Completed

As part of a multi-year upgrade of the Library facility, several major projects were completed during the Summer of 2003. Most of the carpeting on the upper level was replaced, new countertops, sinks, and faucets were installed in all the public restrooms, and some repainting was completed. This follows the successful completion of Phase 1 which included the recarpeting and painting of the Media Resource Center, re-carpeting of the main stairwell, the replacement of the Reference Desk, and the replacement of 50 study chairs. Phase 3 is planned for the Summer of 2004.

9. Materials Processing Milestones Reached

Through the concerted efforts of Collection Services Department staff, under the leadership of Julie Deardorff, *Assistant Director for Collection Services*, the cataloging backlog was virtually erased over the year. This means that new Library materials are progressing into the collection more quickly than anytime in recent memory. In addition, with the services of OCLC TECHPRO and Steve Brown, our Cataloging Consultant, specialized resource and original cataloging are being completed in a very timely manner. This major accomplishment is the result of a broad re-structuring of the Collection Services department, re-assignments for department staff, and significant training for those involved in the cataloging process. As a result of this effort, over 11,000 items were added to the collection, almost doubling the number of any previous year (8,828 volumes to the print collection). During 2001/2002 only about 6,300 items were added, with the previous high being about 6,700 during 2000/2001.

10. National Library Week Celebrated

For the first time in the history of the Centennial Library, the Library staff, under the leadership of Tonya Fawcett, *Assistant Director for Reader Services*, chose to celebrate National Library Week with a number of activities. These activities included a rare Bible collection exhibit, lunch with Cedar Cliff public school librarians, a story hour in the Curriculum Materials Center for first grade classes from Cedar Cliff public school, the first year of what will become an annual used book sale, and a faculty reception "@ your library." The week culminated with the presentation of the Centennial Library Scholarship Award in Library Science during Honor's Day Chapel.

With a continued emphasis on **Library staff development**, 10 different workshops, focusing on software training, skills enhancement, and cataloging skills, were attended by 7 staff members.

Library Student Assistants worked about 14,000 hours, representing an equivalent of 6.8 full time staff members. Forty percent of the Library's service hours are under the direct supervision of Student Assistants and their Student Shift Leaders. Completed the second year of **pay rate adjustments for student** assistants. The third year of adjustments, planned for 2003/2004, will bring the starting hourly rate to \$6.00.

Service Highlights

Continued our heavy involvement with the **OhioLINK PCirc direct borrowing** system with over 19,000 PCirc transactions during the academic year, an increase of about 27% over 2001/2002. In addition, Cedarville faculty and students borrowed 11,213 books from other OhioLINK libraries, a 35% increase over 2001/2002.

OhioLINK patrons *[those at other Ohio institutions]* borrowed 11.9% more books from the Centennial Library than in 2001/2002, totaling 7,913 titles.

Docutek electronic reserves system continues to be popular with faculty. The number of "checkouts" by students was over 5,000 for the second year in a row. **Total reserve materials usage** was up by 17%.

Circulation of Library print and media materials exceeded 80,000 for the first time in the history of the Library. *(See Table 1)*

Reader Services staff scheduled and taught **85 user education sessions**. The program serviced 40 faculty members in all 12 departments. Had contact in these sessions with total of 1,455 students either in person or on-line. In addition, the CMC Librarian entertained a total of **25 classes, meeting in the CMC for** orientation and instruction.

Answered a total of 5,483 **reference questions,** down 14% from 2001/2002. This could be a factor of more individualized reference services. *See IRS below.*

In addition to OhioLINK, handled a total of 3,546 lending and borrowing transactions in Interlibrary Services. Total transactions by Interlibrary Services, including OhioLINK, increased by 24.4% over 20001/2002 to 22,672.

Experienced our third year of the **"Ask a Librarian" service** on the Library web page. A total of 59 queries were handled on-line.

The *IRS*, or the **Independent Research Service**, is available to seniors working on research projects, graduate students, and faculty members working on advanced degrees or in-depth research. *IRS* is offered by appointment, and each user is assigned for the length of the project to one of the Reference Librarians, who will provide individualized assistance. During our second year, 74 senior research students were served in the program, up from only 21 in 2001/2002..

Continued provision of <u>free</u> laser printing at the public workstations produced a total of 200,908 prints on the 11 printers available, down 8.8% from 2001/2002.

Of the 199 teaching faculty, 110 (55%) participated in the **selection of materials for the Library collection** during the academic year. This is a slight decrease from 2001/2002, and is below the 67% recorded in 1999/2000. All departments did participate with an average for each of department of 55% of their faculty being involved.

With the addition of a Staff Cataloger, the establishment of a contract with OCLC TechPro to perform the cataloging on music CD's and videotapes, and the engaging of a Cataloging Consultant to complete original and difficult cataloging, the **backlog of items to be processed was eliminated**. Items are now placed in the collection within a couple of weeks of being received, where in recent years (as recently as 1 year ago), it might have taken a couple of months.

Library faculty from Reader Services and Collection Services **met with all the faculty in 3 departments** – Music, Nursing, and Psychology – to review available resources and discuss materials selection.

The **Instructional Technology Assistant Service Production Specialist** completed multiple projects for or with University faculty and staff, totaling almost 800 hours of multi-media design and video production work. A major

project involved the redesign of 11 PowerPoint chapters for the PACL instructors. This project alone involved 250 hours and also included an interactive animation of the heart blood flow.

Media Resource Center facility, equipment and service upgrades were completed to better serve student needs. New carpeting, computer furniture, and additional computers were installed, bringing the total number of public computer stations to 24, all now with flat screen monitors. In addition, there are 3 scanners, 2 laser color printers, 4 black and white laser printers, and 2 color Inkjet printers

For the second year, Media Services staff, MRC computer lab assistants, and Language Lab assistants received **computer training** from Computer Services staff. This training included how to trouble shoot simple hardware problems, reload print drivers, clean off hard drives, and reset monitor displays. This allows for more rapid problem-solving for MRC patrons.

Produced and marketed 3 videotape programs in both VHS and DVD formats--Senior Program, Nursing Convocation, and Graduation--with 250 copies sold.

Laptops and portable projectors available through AV Services to faculty increased to 6 during the year. A total of 130 laptop usages were recorded with 14 requests unfilled because of unavailable equipment.

Classroom technology installations supported by AV Services continue to increase. Completed the year with 51 tech classrooms after the addition of the Tyler Digital Communication Center facility. In addition, AV Services is responsible for portable tech carts, as well as technology support for 3 conference rooms and the Executive Board Room. The number of technology classrooms will rise to 65 with the completion of the Health/Rec facility and the remodeling of the Athletic Center during the summer of 2003.

Reader Services faculty **collaborated with the Writing Center** to provide four workshops on the following topics: plagiarism, citing MLA, using the EBSCO databases, and copyright.

For the 10th year, continued to publish the **Centennial Library CedarLINK E-News**, distributed electronically to all faculty and staff 5 times during the academic year.

The first annual Centennial Library National Library Week **book sale** was held in April with almost 500 books available for purchase, earning almost \$190.

Operations Highlights

Continued the preparation of **Personal Work Development Plans** for all Library faculty and staff as part of our service quality and performance management program. All Library staff and faculty prepare and review annually Personal Work Development Plans as part of the PASport Performance Assessment Program. As part of the PASport program, completed the second full year of Library faculty and staff performance assessment. In addition, instituted a pilot program of Administrator Performance Assessment. The three Department heads were evaluated by departmental employees. This evaluation appeared to be successful and profitable, and will be implemented every three years.

Proposed and implemented a process for evaluating **non-tenure track** Library faculty every three years. *(See Exhibit 1)*

Continued patron feedback **assessment**, **including user education sessions evaluation**, **and the annual Graduating Senior Library Survey and the Freshman Library Survey**. Experienced a 47 % response rate for the Senior Survey and a 49% response rate for the Freshman Survey. Between these two surveys, 736 students (about 25 % of the student body) evaluated Centennial Library resources and services, and offered comments.

Completed an extensive revision of the Library Assessment Plan. (See Exhibit 2)

Added over 11,000 items to the **collection**, **almost doubling the number added during any previous year**– 8,828 volumes to the print collection, 986 volumes to the bound periodical collection, and 1,552 items to the media collection. During 2001/2002 only about 6,300 items were added, with the previous high being about 6,700 during 2000/2001. *(See Tables 2 & 3)*

A record number of multi-media items were added to the collection - 1552 *(See Table 3)*

During the fiscal year, 5,325 books and 497 media items were **purchased** for the collection. The average cost for a book rose to \$36.46, up 3.3% over 2001/2002.

Expenditures for Library materials exceeded \$425,000 for the first time in the history of the University. The total for books, periodicals, AV materials, software, Curriculum Materials Center, and binding was \$442,873. *(See Table 4)*

Hours of service for the Summer of 2003 were increased by 5% to a total of 61.25 per week.

New <u>print</u> periodical subscriptions for the academic year totaled 32; 39 titles ceased, were discarded, or were discontinued, bringing the number of print subscriptions to 929. The Library provides access to over 4,500 full-text journal titles on-line.

Because of insufficient funds, the backlog of **unfunded periodical print subscription requests** for 2002/2003 was 24 titles, totaling about \$5,700.

A total of over 4,500 **gift items** were received by the Library, including books, journals, computer software, and media.

A total of 394 items and 8 file boxes were added to the **Archives collection** including 45 books written by Cedarville University faculty or alumni.

The number of **electronic databases** available to our faculty and students is now at 143, 17% more than were available in 2001/2002. Most of these databases are provided through arrangements with OhioLINK.

Continued the upgrading of Library media, office, and computer

equipment. Using a combination of Library budget funds and general University funds, almost \$93,000 was spent on computer, office, and media equipment. *(See Table 5)*
