Doug Cherry, a former runner and 1983 graduate of Twin City Nazarene School, is a member of the Cedarville (OH) College cross country team. Doug is the son of Dr. and Mrs. W.E. Cherry of 1513 First Avenue in Sterling. He has received some varsity experience this fall as a freshman on the squad. In Cedarville's first meet of the year, Cherry placed fifth for the Jackets and 14th overall to help C.C. win the five-team event.

The Yellow Jackets possess the best cross country team in the school's history this year. Cedarville has already won two invitationals and finished second in two others. For the sixth straight year, the Jackets will host the national meet for the National Christian College Athletic Association on November 12. The team is also expected to qualify for the NAIA Nationals which will be run a week later in Kenosha, WI.

Cedarville is a Baptist, liberal arts college located in southwestern Ohio, 25 miles east of Dayton. The school has an enrollment of approximately 1800 students.
