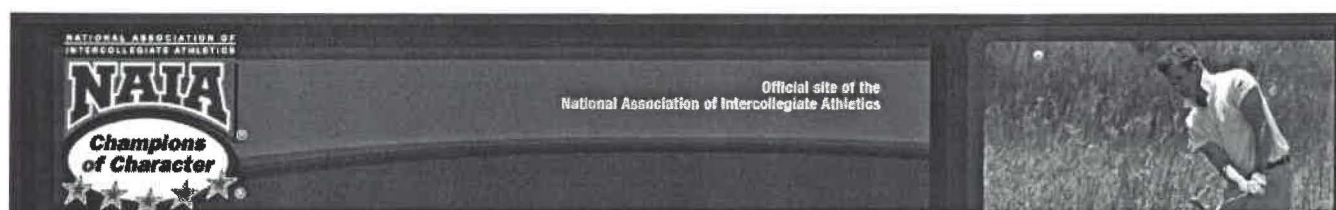

**Men's Golf****Men's Golf****Eagles edge out University of British Columbia by 23 points****May 8, 2009**

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – In the final edition of the NAIA Men's Golf Coaches' Top 25 Poll (May 8), Oklahoma Christian upholds the No. 1 ranking for the fifth straight time. The Eagles chalked up 589 points and 18 of the possible 21 first-place votes.

The University of British Columbia, who was the preseason No. 1, holds at No. 2. The Thunderbirds have been the second-ranked team for the last five polls. UBC earned three first-place votes and 567 total points.

Sliding in at No. 3 is Oklahoma City with 560 total points. The Stars remain No. 3 with 560 points. No. 4 Wayland Baptist (Texas) and No. 5 Berry (Ga.) complete the Top 5.

There are no previously un-ranked teams to enter the final rating.

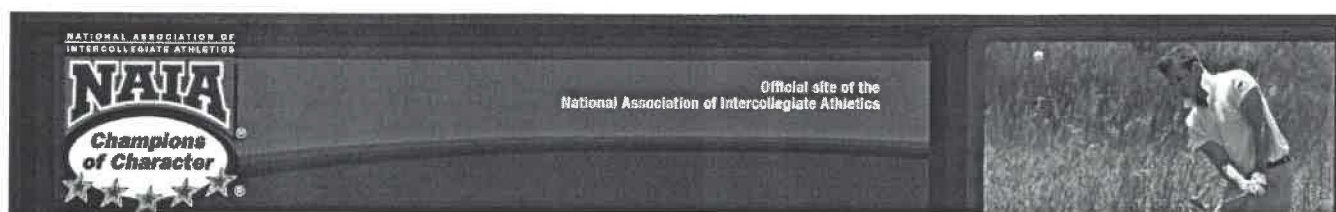

Oklahoma Christian holds at No. 1 in NAIA Men's Golf Coaches' Top 25 Poll

Eagles land top spot for fourth consecutive week

April 24, 2009

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – In the fourth edition of the NAIA Men's Golf Coaches' Top 25 Poll (April 24), Oklahoma Christian boasts the No. 1 ranking for the fourth straight time. The Eagles tallied 588 points and 17 of the possible 21 first-place votes. OC is gearing up for the Sooner Athletic Conference Championship from April 27-28 in Shawnee, Okla.

The University of British Columbia, who was the preseason No. 1, holds at No. 2. The Thunderbirds have been the second-ranked team for the last four polls. UBC earned two first-place votes and 567 total points.

Checking in at No. 3 is Oklahoma City with 561 total points. The Stars, which have their women's program ranked No. 1, snared the remaining two first-place votes. No. 4 Wayland Baptist (Texas) and No. 5 Berry (Ga.) round out the Top 5.

Dakota Wesleyan (S.D.) fell out of the Top 25 this week after holding a No. 24 spot last time.

The final rating (#5) will be released on Friday, May 8, 2009.

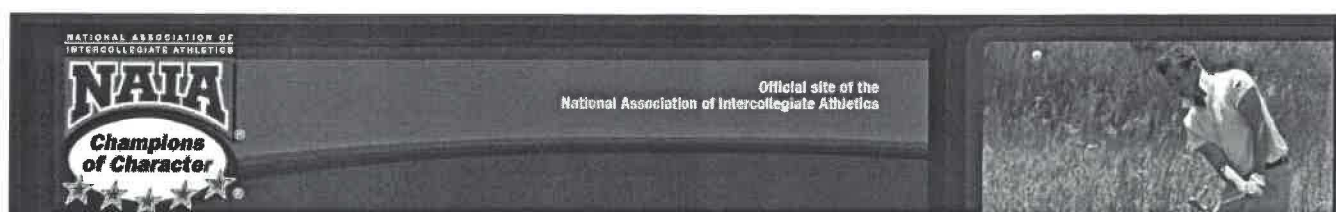

Oklahoma Christian remains No. 1 in NAIA Men's Golf Coaches' Top 25 Poll

The Eagles lead a tight pack of teams with 578 total points

April 10, 2009

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – Oklahoma Christian University stays on top of the third NAIA Men's Golf Coaches' Top 25 Poll (April 10) earning 578 total points. For the third straight ranking, OC is No. 1 and notched 10 first-place votes this time. OC took second most recently at the Gaillardia Intercollegiate hosted by Oklahoma City. The Eagles defeated three Top 20 teams at the event. OCU is leading a close race for No. 1, holding a six-point advantage over the second-place team and 14 points over No. 3.

The next six teams held their positions from the last poll. No. 2 British Columbia posted 572 points, including seven first-place votes. In three events this Spring, the Thunderbirds have finished first one time and second on two other occasions. No. 3 Oklahoma City grabs the remaining four first-place votes and 564 total points. Wayland Baptist (Texas), the third Sooner Athletic Conference team in the Top 5, checks in at No. 4. Rounding out the Top 5 is Malone (Ohio).

Missouri Valley fell out of the Top 25 this week as the Vikings were No. 24 last time. Bethany (Kan.) filled in that hole as the Swedes are listed at No. 25 this week.

The next rating (#4) will be released on April 24, 2009.

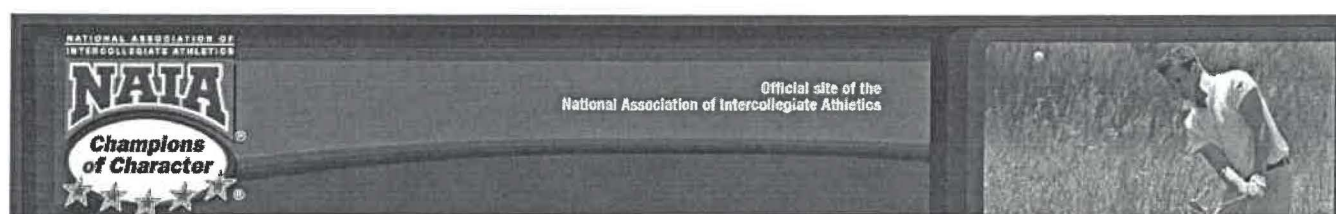

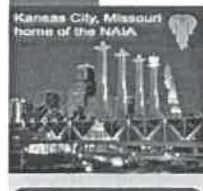

**Men's Golf****Oklahoma Christian holds at No. 1 in NAIA Men's Golf Coaches' Top 25 Poll**

The Eagles tallied 18 first-place votes and 559 total points

March 27, 2009

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – In the second NAIA Men's Golf Coaches' Top 25 Poll (March 27), the Oklahoma Christian men's golf team held on to the No. 1 ranking for the second straight time. The Eagles placed second at the California Baptist University Spring Break Collegiate last week falling two strokes shy of their third Tournament title this season. OC grabbed 18 of the possible 20 first-place votes and 559 total points.

Right behind Oklahoma Christian is defending national champ, British Columbia. No. 2 UBC earned the other two first-place nods and 542 total points. Oklahoma City moves up two spots to No. 3 while Wayland Baptist (Texas) is at No. 4 and Malone (Ohio) is at No. 5.

Two teams fell out of the Top 25 from last time (Feb. 27), William Woods (Mo.) at No. 23 and Embry-Riddle (Fla.) at No. 25. Cal State-East Bay jumped up to No. 21 while Davenport (Mich.) finds itself at No. 23.

The next rating (#3) will be released on April 7, 2009.

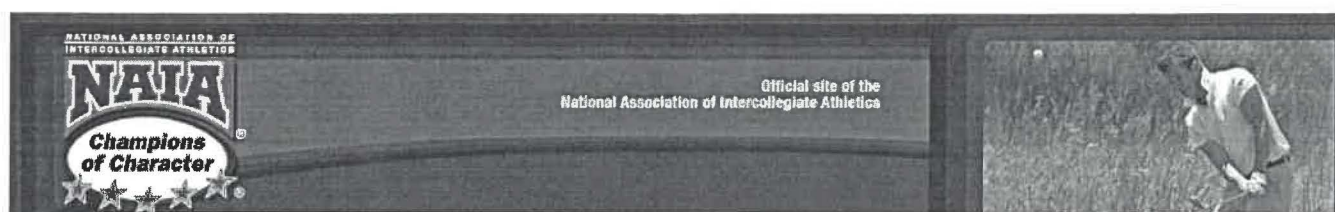

**Men's Golf****Oklahoma Christian No. 1 In NAIA Men's Golf Coaches' Top 25 Poll**

The Eagles received 17 first place votes and 528 points

Feb. 27, 2009

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – Oklahoma Christian men's golf team earned the top spot in the first NAIA Men's Golf Coaches' Top 25 Poll. The Eagles received 17 first place votes and 528 points and moved up two spots from the fall rating.

The defending national champion, British Columbia dropped a spot from the fall ratings to No. 2 with two first place votes and 513 points. Wayland Baptist (Texas) moved up to No. 3 from No. 4 with 493 points while Malone (Ohio) climbed two spots to No. 4 with 454 points. Oklahoma City fell to No. 5 from No. 2 with 453 points.

South Carolina-Beaufort also dropped from the fall ratings to No. 7 from No. 5 with 444 points. Berry (Ga.) and Victoria (B.C.) both switched spots at No. 8 and No. 9 with 401 and 394 points respectively. No. 10 Lee (Tenn.) moved up a spot with 362 points to round out the top-10.

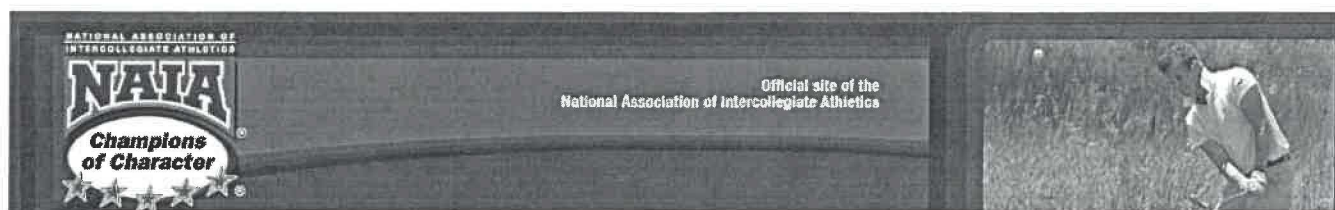

Kansas City, Mo. - The University of British Columbia earned 10 of the possible 17 first place votes and ranked No. 1 in the 2008 National Association Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) Men's Golf Fall Rating. The defending National Champions received a total of 461 points.

Oklahoma City University claimed the No. 2 spot only six points behind UBC at 456 and adding six first place votes. In third place was the defending National Runner-up, Oklahoma Christian University, with 428 points. At No. 4 was Wayland Baptist University (Texas) with 423 points. Rounding out the top 5 and receiving one first place vote was the University of South Carolina - Beaufort with 389 total points.

The first spring rating will be released on Tuesday, Feb. 24, 2009.
