HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

JOSH OWUSU Angelo State University



Josh Owusu, a native of Ghana, quickly became one of Angelo State University's all-time top student-athletes, breaking records and earning all-America honors in both track and field and in the classroom.

Owusu came to Angelo State in 1971 and set school records in both the long and triple jump while winning Lone Star Conference individual event titles in the two events his freshman season.

His track and field career would eventually see him win six NAIA outdoor individual track titles, one indoor title, several international competition championships, and a spot in the Olympic games. He set three national meet records during his performances.

Owusu won the NAIA outdoor long jump (25-10) and triple jump (50-9) in 1971, the indoor (25-7 1/2) and outdoor (25-6 1/4) long jump in 1972, the outdoor triple jump (53-0) in 1973, and the outdoor long jump (26-6) and triple jump (52-10 1/2) in 1974.

The 1972 season saw him finish fourth in the long jump in the Munich Summer Olympic Games with a leap of 26-3 1/2. He was a pre-meet favorite for the 1976 Montreal Olympics, but missed his chance when Ghana joined the African boycott of the Games.

Owusu, who won nine individual Lone Star Conference championships, still holds Angelo State records of 26-10 3/4 in the long jump and 54-1 3/4 in the triple jump.

He graduated from Angelo State in 1974 and holds a bachelor of science degree in chemistry. He received his master's of science degree from Texas Tech University in chemical engineering. Today, Owusu is the owner and operator of his own chemical engineering firm in Abilene, Texas. He and his wife, Doris, have two children. He is also active in the ASU Ex-Students Association and maintains a strong association with the ASU athletic department, working as a field event official for many of the championship meets held at ASU.

JAMES HAWKINS Tarleton State University



The most highly honored track and field athlete at Tarleton State University, James Hawkins burst onto the national spotlight in 1983 when he soared over the bar at 7' 5" at the Tarleton Relays. At the time, the leap was the best ever in Texas and was assumed to be the best ever in NAIA history.

With that leap, Hawkins became the favorite to win the outdoor title at the national meet. He didn't disappoint as he jumped an NAIA Championship meet record 2.20 meters (7' 2 3/4") to capture his first of three NAIA national titles.

Hawkins, from San Antonio, actually came to Tarleton in 1981 for the chance to play intercollegiate basketball. He did play in 63 varsity games, but the high jump is where his fame rose.

As a freshman, he shattered the Texas Intercollegiate Athletic Association meet record with a 7' 2" leap. He finished sixth in his first NAIA national meet appearance, going 6' 11". In 1983 he won his second TIAA title with a 7' 0 1/2" jump before claiming the NAIA title. Following that championship effort, Hawkins was also named to the NAIA Outdoor Track and Field Academic All-America team after maintaining a 3.2 grade point average in computer science.

In 1984, Hawkins claimed a double championship by winning the NAIA indoor high jump crown with a 7' 1" jump and then claiming the Outdoor title with a 7' 1 1/4" effort.

In 1984, Hawkins finished fourth in the Indoor Championship with a 7' 0" leap. In the Outdoor Championship, he slipped on a wet surface on his first effort and then passed to the winning height, but failed on all three attempts.

Hawkins finished his career with a school record 7' 5" mark, a national indoor title, back-to-back national outdoor titles, and a 7' 2 3/4" national record that still stands. He was an NAIA all-America selection five times and an NAIA Academic all-America.

Hawkins, 26 and single, is a Manufacturing Technology Engineer for General Dynamics in Ft. Worth, Texas.

National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics INFORMATION



The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a completely autonomous association, currently administering programs of intercollegiate athletics to nearly 500 fully-accredited colleges and universities of moderate enrollment. The fundamental tenet of the NAIA is that intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the total educational program of the institution. This belief is strongly reflected in the governing documents, activities and structure of the association.

HISTORY AND PURPOSE

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball (NAIB), the NAIA emanated from a "National Small College Basketball Tournament" inaugurated in 1937 in Kansas City, Missouri. The conversion of the NAIB to the NAIA came in 1952 when the organization expanded beyond basketball and added national championship events in golf, outdoor track and field and tennis. Football, cross country, baseball and swimming and diving were added to the championship calendar in 1956, and wrestling (1958), soccer (1959), bowling (1962-78), gymnastics (1964-84), indoor track and field (1966), ice hockey (1968-83) and volleyball (1969-80) were late additions.

Of major significance to the NAIA was the establishment of the women's division within the association on August 1, 1980. The NAIA's decision to offer competitive opportunities and championships in women's athletics was passed by the membership following two years of study and proposals by an ad hoc committee on the implementation of a women's division in the NAIA. Currently, the association conducts 10 championship event programs for women in the sports of basketball, cross country, fast-pitch softball, gymnastics, indoor and outdoor track and field, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis and volleyball.

The initial purpose of the NAIA, to provide national championship athletic opportunities to institutions below the so-called "major" level, has indeed been well served. The association clearly outlines its own responsibilities and those of its members: a sound athletics program, administered and controlled by those responsible for the administration of the institution. This means direct supervision in caliber of competition, financing of the program and taking steps to assure that financial assistance is made available only through the institution and under the same general policies as aid to all students. In short, the basic premise is that the athletics program is a basic component of the overall educational process and not an entity apart.

ADMINISTRATION

The NAIA is governed by two bodies. The Council of Presidents, composed of one president from each district, is responsible for fiscal matters, academic standards and supervision of the national staff. The 10-person National Executive Committee, elected by the membership, is responsible for organizing championship events and overseeing the committees and associations. The executive director conducts the day-to-day operation of the national office, headquartered in Kansas City, Missouri. A full-time staff of 22 serves the membership at the national level.

The district is the basic unit of the NAIA. The association is organized into 32 geographical districts spread through the 50 states and part of Canada. Each district is governed by a district executive committee which administers district playoff events, the champions of which qualify to compete in NAIA area and national championship events.

Eligibility rules within the NAIA govern all play in all sports recognized by the association, not just postseason play. All eligibility guidelines must be adhered to by all members, including those holding dual affiliation with other associations. Certification of eligibility of all NAIA participants is accomplished through a network of people including faculty athletics representatives, district eligibility chairs, and the National Eligibility Committee.

MEMBERSHIP

Any four-year college or university of upper-level, two year institution in the United States and Canada that awards the bachelor's degree or equivalent may hold active NAIA membership. Active member institutions must be fully accredited by an appropriate accrediting agency or commission.

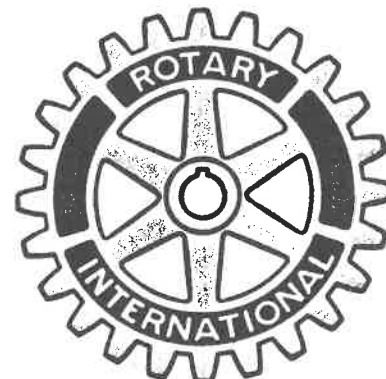
OBLIGATION

Member institutions must conduct their intercollegiate athletics programs with the standards of the regulatory associations in which they hold membership and the NAIA. They must pay their annual membership dues and be in support of the policies of the NAIA. Where institutional rules and standards are more stringent than those of the regulatory group or the NAIA, those rules and standards of the institution are recognized and supported by the NAIA.

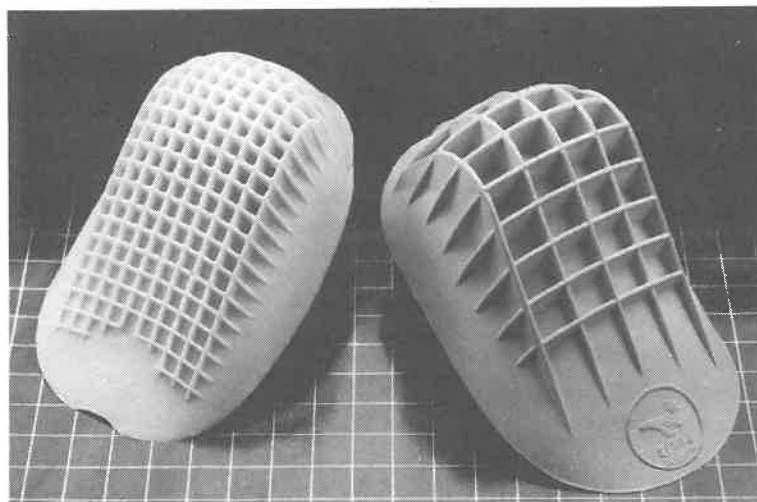
