Listening to the Democratic Party Convention as the votes are being cast causes me to write about the events that led to McGovern's nomination. Sen. Muskie had a handful of votes and Sen. Humphrey had a large and significant block of votes. Other candidates had various percentages of the remaining vote. Then came the bargaining that had its effect on the democratic process. Something called party unity and pressures were brought to bare and constituency and primaries lost their importance. Leaders began to make decisions and the result as everyone knows was the yielding and the winning of a nomination.

First there was the real fact that the McGovern forces were partly supported by many liberal zealots. Many of the young people had chosen to support McGovern or he had given credence to their positions. But ironically, the tabulations indicated that McGovern clearly did not have the votes to win. Secondly, formidable leaders were holding out their own opposition to the liberal candidate. Had there been two or three ballots the changing of votes could have gone either way. But, the fact is that only if Sen. Humphrey and Sen. Muskie had stayed around for the first and second ballot had the people really seen the convention process in action and perhaps the story would have been decidedly different. But, they didn't stay around. Who advised them- no one knows. Who told Muskie to follow suit- no one knows. They dropped out and presumably because of the risk of defeat, or in the name of something called

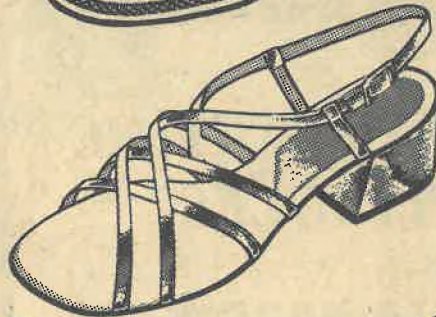

4-H CLUB

4-H Clubs were originated in nearby Springfield, Ohio by a man named A.B. Grahm. The original meeting place of the 4-H group was at the high school in Springfield now known as Springfield South.

4-H Clubs in the Cedarville area are primarily agriculture and Home Economics oriented. But, in fact in other towns the per cent of members from the agricultural community may be as low as 50 per cent. This week at Camp Clifton many 4-H Club members are attending the camp and there are about as many rural members as city members.

The 4-H Clubs provide programs of training in many areas of interest. Members may work on projects in agriculture, sewing, cooking, livestock, auto maintenance, fishing sports, swimming, handcrafts and nature.

At nearby Camp Clifton, seven counties support and attend the camp. Each week over 200 4-H members attend and enjoy such activities as swimming, tether ball, basketball, hand crafts, nature study, canoeing, and contests of various kinds. Swimming lessons are provided and fishing is permitted. The campers go on hikes, enjoy drama and song fests and learn citizenship.

The camp is staffed by college students or recent graduates.

Each week a new group of campers attends the facilities and they bring along their own staff of counselors and program directors. There is a full time resident director that stays at the camp for the summer and other staff members are employed full time for the summer.

party unity- a factor of importance AFTER the votes are tallied. A competitive primary and convention system and Senators that are somehow convinced that they could save face by dropping from the contest.

There is a bit of irony in the nomination of Sen. McGovern.

The very ones that shouted for a more democratic convention, even direct primaries, were a party to the short cut system and the bargaining of a democracy.

The very leaders of the party failed to their responsibilities, not only to their constituencies but also, to the democratic process.

So, the democratic party has nominated Sen. G. GEORGE McGovern for the party candidacy for the presidency. How he was nominated is important but, also the candidate himself is now important. Sen. McGovern may have the ability to lead or be the leader of such a wide variety of political thought. The extreme liberals have a candidate that will carry their banner in the campaign and in the years ahead if elected.

There is some value to having leadership and representation in the political process. But, we must be careful that while we are at work our principals are also represented in government. Pressure alone does not constitute politics, and never must it be allowed to dominate.

There is a bright spot on the horizon. And that is Sen. Thomas Eagleton. Sen. Eagleton is a man of reason from the fine state of Missouri. He is also a Roman Catholic. He has been reported to have made a famous statement that he considers each issue separately and somewhat without regard to party politics. What that means is that as long as he does not get caught up in the liberal drift of the dems platform Candidate McGovern will at the least have a voice from a man of reason that is willing to study the issues. That does not mean that the Vice Presidential candidate will rule the day. Rather it means that there is a factor of balance on the democratic ticket.

Gardening in the shade always presents some extra problems but none that are inseparable. You can have just as attractive a garden, and sometimes just as colorful a one as in the sun, garden experts say.

The main thing is to choose the right plants. Of course, everyone knows about ferns—reliable, effective, easy to grow, but not very colorful. Along with these go such old reliables as English ivies in a variety of forms, vinca, pachysandra and any of several wild gingers.

Closely related to these in color are those whose green leaves exhibit a variety of tones, such as the fancy-leaved caladiums with their rose, pink and white variegations and the green and white hostas. With still more color in their leaves are the various coleus, some of which also include reds and yellowish tones.

However, for still brighter colors one must turn to the flowering plants. Without doubt, the most effective of these are the tuberous-rooted begonias which come in a variety of forms such as singles, semi-doubles, daffodil-like, camellias and rosebuds and in all colors except blue and green. Grown from "bulbs," they need little care besides adequate food and moisture, and protection from the burning sun. They must be stored indoors over winter.

Also colorful and at home in such places are the impatiens or patient Lucy plants, with blooms like individual phlox flowers in all the tones from red to white with some orange and salmon hues. Easy to grow from seeds or cuttings, they can be very effective, especially the new, low-growing Elfin types.

Where hanging or trailing plants are suitable one can also grow blue or white browallias, which are frequently sold for hanging baskets on porches.

Pansies are also at home in cool, shaded places and bloom much longer under such conditions.

Spade and prepare the soil as usual, making sure that the food supply and drainage are adequate. Keep down weeds by hoeing or cultivating as usual and, if slugs become pests, scatter any good slug bait you can buy in your area. It won't bother pets or birds.

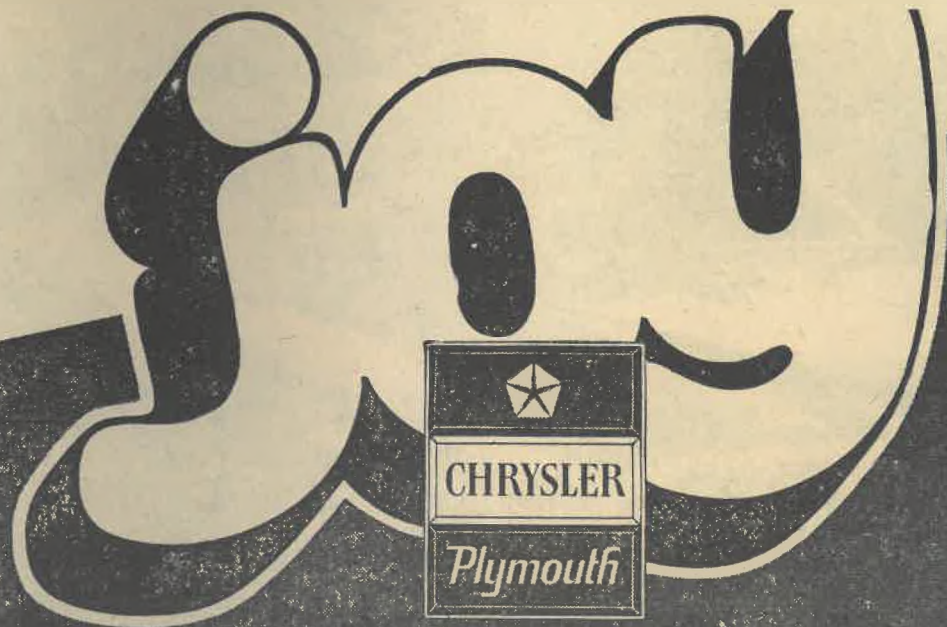

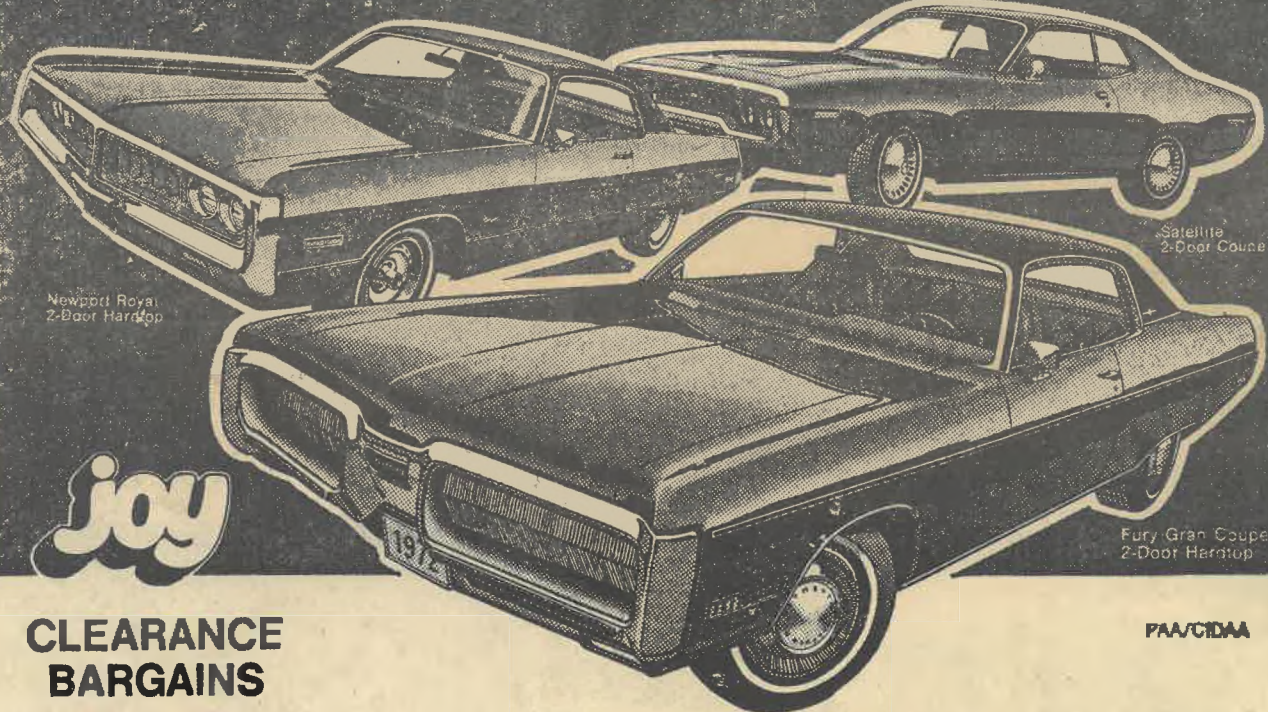
