The Cedarville College women's basketball team suffered through a 6-21 season a year ago, but first-year coach Bob Fires hopes to build a foundation for the future. Fires, who coached the men's junior varsity last year, plans on instilling a basic style and philosophy of basketball in 1985-86.

This year's team should be a more disciplined team that will rely on a half-court attack and not so much on the fast-break. The Jackets will mostly use a man-to-man defense.

The team's best player, Jewel Schroder, will not be available until January because she is student teaching in Ecuador. She average 14.5 points a game last year. Another top returnee is Karen Headdings who averaged 10.5 points and 8.5 rebounds per outing. Fires' top newcomer is 5-9 freshman Christine Friesen of Redding, California.

The Lady Jackets will host the Cedarville Invitational on December 6-7. They will also host the NCCAA Nationals for the second year in a row on March 6-8.

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
