Leading by Faith

DeMaurice Smith Wins Top Alumnus Award

When DeMaurice F. Smith graduated from Cedarville University (then Cedarville College) in 1985, he had no idea what the rest of his life would look like.

Twenty-five years later, as the NFL Players Association's Executive Director, Smith has no idea what the immediate future holds for his organization.

But in both situations, Smith sees an important parallel: living by faith.

"The beautiful thing about faith [is] you take that step without knowing where it's going to end," Smith told a crowd of more than 3,000 here as he accepted the university's 2010 Alumnus of the Year award.

"I look at the people that I went to school with ... friends of mine who continue to be close friends today," Smith said as he addressed the Cedarville student body. "All of us growing up and moving through and sitting right where you are now, not knowing what God had in store for us, but each of us taking steps because we believed ...

"It is the courage and the faith to take that step that will lead you through."

Now that Smith finds himself heading up one of the most influential groups in American sports during a crucial labor negotiation, his faith is more important than ever.

"I've got a job where I've taken a pretty interesting step and frankly, I don't know how it's going to end," Smith said. "But I do know a couple of things. Upon this rock I stand. On faith, we will make our steps to move forward because that's how I was taught and trained to be a leader by guys like Coach Elvin King ...

"And I know that regardless of what we do, our organization will end up stronger, more vibrant and more dedicated to the people it is to serve, because I understand vision and leadership from men like [Cedarville president] Dr. (Bill) Brown."

Smith said he "truly grew up" during his time as a student at the small Christian university. The former NCCAA All-American in

track told the crowd that no one—least of all Smith himself or King (his college coach)—would have believed what was in store for him down the road.

"If someone would have come up to both of us and said, 'This somewhat fast guy who really didn't like to practice all that much is one day gonna find himself as a leader of men and their families,' we'd both laugh," Smith chuckled.

But through his time at Cedarville, Smith honed the skills and maturity that have catapulted him to such a vital position in the professional football world.

"He certainly was developing leadership qualities," Cedarville sports information director Mark Womack said of Smith's time in college. "Being involved in leadership positions like student government, class president, class officer—De was very personable, and you could tell that he was a good communicator.

"He was very visible and popular, in a good way. In hindsight, you can see he possessed the qualities that made him what he is today."

Smith credits the university with developing his ability to think critically. "The training here, whether it was law, economics, American government, politics—there are any number of intersection points that are important to understanding the business of football. My first foray in understanding all of those things took place on this ground."

CU vice president Robert Rohm remembers Smith as "a great student," saying, "He was the kind of student you just wish you had tons and tons of. That he's a Cedarville grad just makes us proud."

Smith referenced Martin Luther King, Jr. and biblical hero Abraham as examples of living by faith. He is directing the NFLPA during uncertain times.

"I don't know what the next step is going to be, but I can tell you I have faith and trust that we have been prepared and that we are solidified in our faith to make that next step," Smith concluded.

Womack is thankful for the way Smith represents his alma mater on such a visible stage. "To see where the Lord has put De is phenomenal," he said.

"Cedarville touts preparing the students for whatever God's going to put in front of them, and this is a test of that."

Yellow Jacket Alumni Updates

Ryan Chaney, a 2010 graduate of Cedarville University and former Yellow Jacket soccer player, is the varsity soccer coach at his alma mater - Calvary Christian Academy in Cresaptown, Maryland. He is also a member of the CCA faculty teaching math.

He played four years on the men's soccer team at Cedarville University and was co-captain his junior and senior years.

Chaney earned NAIA, NCCAA and AMC Scholar-Athlete honors while playing for the Yellow Jackets.

Chaney, a defender, played in 60 matches for CU while scoring four goals and adding six assists.

Chaney, whose soccer number is one of only two numbers ever retired at Calvary Christian, is the all-time leading scorer in Calvary soccer history. During his prep career, he scored 145 goals with 70 assists for a total of 360 points in 97 games for an average of 3.71 per game. He was named to the Mason Dixon Christian Conference All-Conference team and the Times-News All-Area first team all four years of his high school career. During that span the Eagles compiled a record of 74-21-2.

Jones, a 2005 graduate of Cedarville University, is finishing her third season as varsity volleyball coach at Cedarville High School.

Jones is CU's all-time career assist leader with 6,662 which ranks sixth in the history of the NAIA. Her 2,403 assists in the 2004 season are the most ever compiled in a single season of NAIA volleyball. Jones was the 2004 National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) Player of the Year and along with Aker helped CU claim the 2005 NCCAA national title.

Aker, a 2007 graduate of Cedarville University, is completing her second season as varsity volleyball coach at Springfield (OH) Shawnee High School. She holds the all-time career record at Cedarville with 2,882 digs. Aker's dig total ranks fourth all-time in the NAIA and her 41 single-season matches in double figure digs rates fifth-best in NAIA volleyball.

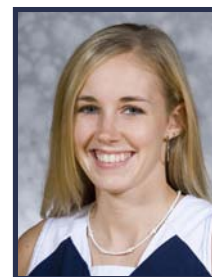
Brittany Smart, a 2007 graduate of Cedarville University and former Lady Jacket basketball player, recently signed a contract to play professionally in Sweden. Smart, the all-time leading scorer in Ohio women's college basketball history with 3,236 points, will play with the Kvarnby Basketball Club in Molndal, Sweden during the 2010-11 season.

Smart's latest opportunity follows two seasons (2007-09) of play in Belgium and action this past summer with a semi-pro team in Beloit, Wisconsin.

"I still had a passion for basketball," she said. "I needed to be prepared no matter what....I thought, 'I'm going to keep training hard even if I don't do anything. That way I'll be ready.' Now I'm confident. I don't feel out of the loop."

Smart was the 2006-07 NAIA II National Player of the Year and a three-time NAIA All-America First Team selection during her Cedarville career.

Smart holds numerous career records at CU including scoring average (22.8 ppg) and free throw percentage (.837).

Daniel Rose, a 2009 graduate of Cedarville University and former Yellow Jacket basketball player, recently completed a season of professional basketball in China. Rose, a 6-10 center, played for ShenYang Donjin and averaged 16 points per game and 10.1 rebounds per contest.

Rose, Cedarville's all-time leader in blocked shots, tallied four blocks per game for ShenYang Donjin while hitting .583 from the field.

Rose was the #7 overall first round pick in the 2010 NBL China draft. He had previously played one season of pro ball in Mexico.

In the 2008-09 campaign with the Yellow Jackets, Rose appeared in 31 games and tallied 11.3 points per game. He brought down 6.5 boards per contest and averaged 2.7 blocks per game.

Rose set a Cedarville single game record with 11 blocked shots against Notre Dame College OH on February 7, 2009.

2010-11 Yellow Jacket Basketball Set to Begin



Impressive hoops schedule on tap for Jackets

The defending NAIA Division II champion and the 2009 NCAA Division II winner are just two of the formidable opponents that make up the 2010-11 Yellow Jacket men's basketball schedule.

The Jackets will host the NAIA victor Saint Francis (Ind.) on Nov. 20 on the second day of competition in the 33rd Annual Cedarville Invitational. They travel to Findlay, who went 36-0 to claim the NCAA Division II title, on Nov. 16.

CU opens the season on Nov. 12 against Bluefield (Va.) at the Rio Grande Classic. The first home game is Nov. 19 by facing perennial Mid-Central Conference power Indiana Wesleyan in the Cedarville Invitational.

The Yellow Jackets hit the road to square off with two other NCAA Division II members. They will play the host school at the Gannon (Pa.) Classic on Nov. 26 and later make the long trek to Lake Superior State (Mich.) to battle the Lakers on Dec. 30.

Two other road games include well-respected NAIA programs. Cedarville plays at Huntington on Dec. 18 and at Taylor on Dec. 21.

The 18-game American Midwest Conference schedule features home-and-home assignments with all nine of the other members. Defending champion Walsh visits the Callan Athletic Center on Jan. 22 and the regular season finale on Feb. 19 features Notre Dame (Ohio) at home.

Coach Pat Estepp, starting his third season at the helm, will count on a quartet of seniors to lead the way in 2010-11.

Forward Matt Harner, an AMC Second Teamer, averaged 13.6 points per game last year while hitting a team-best 81 field goals from three-point land.

Point guard Derrick Hannon hit for 7.7 ppg while pacing the squad in assists and steals while forward Adam Riehle started 31 of the 35 games last year and was CU's third-best rebounder with 4.1 caroms per game.

Kenny Reep, a 6-7 post player, appeared in 17 games off the bench last year.

Full slate awaits Lady Jackets in upcoming season

The 2010-11 Lady Jacket basketball schedule features 14 home dates including the Cedarville Classic as well as another trip to Florida.

The 30-game slate tips off on Nov. 12 in the Callan Athletic Center when the Jackets battle Northwestern Ohio at 7:30 p.m. in the Cedarville Classic. Indiana Wesleyan faces Wilberforce in the 5:30 opener.

The Lady Jackets and IWU square off at 3:00 on Nov. 13 following the 1:00 tipoff between UNOH and Wilberforce.

Cedarville will play 16 American Midwest Conference contests - eight at home and eight on the road. They will face five AMC schools twice (Malone, Mount Vernon Nazarene, Notre Dame (Ohio), Ursuline, Wilberforce) and the other six just once.

NCAA Division II members Urbana and Hillsdale (Mich.) will visit for non-conference games as will NCAA Division III Wittenberg and NAIA rep Saint Francis (Ind.).

Highlighting the road assignments is a return trip to the Northwood Classic in West Palm Beach, Fla. on Dec. 29-30. The Jackets will face Albany Pharmacy (N.Y.) and Bethel (Ind.). CU also makes trips to the NCAA Division II trio of Findlay, Urbana and Ohio Dominican.

Head Coach Kirk Martin begins his 10th year at CU and is excited to have four key returning seniors on his roster.

Aubrey Siemon, a 6-1 post player, averaged a double-double last season with 14.4 points and 13.4 rebounds per game. Siemon started all 33 games last winter. The All-AMC First Team selection is CU's fourth all-time leading rebounder with 960 and needs 200 more boards to top the list.

Lydia Miller averaged 11.1 ppg and 5.2 rpg last season while hitting .785 from the free throw line.

Rachel Hurley tossed in 8.8 points per game and led the squad with a .930 mark at the charity stripe.

Caitlyn Brooks also contributed 8.8 ppg and was fourth in rebounding with 4.1 caroms per game.

Miller, Hurley and Brooks started 32 of 33 games in 2009-10.
