AWARDS

Unless otherwise noted, recipients are selected by the faculty of each academic department.

Alumni Scholarship and Grant Endowment Fund Awards.

Interest generated by the Alumni Scholarship and Grant Endowment Fund provides scholarships for an outstanding freshman, sophomore, or junior student (or, in rare circumstances, an outstanding senior applicant) enrolled in each academic department. The award from the department of education is named in memory of J.D. "Jack" Willetts, a former president of the Cedarville University Alumni Association and member of the Class of 1958. This year, the awards for exercise and sport science and science and mathematics will be given in honor of the faithful ministries of Dr. Donald Callan, professor of exercise and sport science and dean of the School of Health and Human Performance; and Mr. L. Bert Frye (posthumously), associate professor emeritus of physical sciences. Dr. Callan is stepping down from his full-time position after serving on the faculty since 1960. Over the years he served as athletic director, head men's basketball coach, department chair, and dean. Mr. Frye came to Cedarville in 1961 and taught in the department of science and mathematics until his retirement in 1985.

Department of Biblical Education

The David G. Canine Award. The family of Rev. David Canine established this award to recognize his devotion to the ministry of the gospel. The recipient of this monetary award will demonstrate potential for successful ministry and exemplary fulfillment of Cedarville University requirements.

The Daniel Award. This award was established by David and Jean Heyd to encourage and assist deserving University students and to honor their parents, Charles and E. LaRue Wilcox and Elmer and Kathryn Heyd. The recipient must be a full-time graduating male senior who has been accepted by a conservative evangelical seminary. The recipient must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.3, demonstrate the spiritual qualifications and godly leadership skills necessary to excel in this ministry, and must plan to serve as full-time pastor of a church. Preference will be given to students planning to pastor in the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches.

The Helen Drullinger Memorial Award. This endowed annual award was established in loving memory of Helen Drullinger to underwrite the education of married ministerial students. The award is granted to a male student enrolled in a Bible program and preparing for professional Christian ministry. He must have one year remaining in his academic program and have a minimum GPA of 3.3. Preference is given to a married student whose wife is working to help pay for his college expenses.

The Hugh T. Hall Memorial Scholarship. The recipient of this monetary award shall have completed two full years at Cedarville, hold the academic rank of senior, be pursuing a degree in biblical education, maintain a grade point average of 3.5 or above, and express a desire to pursue a career in missions or the pastorate. The recipient shall also demonstrate exemplary Christian character, a love for and involvement with people, and a productive ministry in the Christian ministries program.

The Reverend Henry & Lilian Hutchison Christian Education Award.

This award was established by Thomas and Amy Hutchison to honor his parents, Henry and Lilian Hutchison, by subsidizing student expenses for ministry preparation. The recipient must be a full-time junior or senior pursuing a degree in Christian education or youth ministry. The recipient of this cash award must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.3, be actively involved in Christian ministries, and have a demonstrated passion for ministry and excellent potential for communicating the Word of God.

The Joseph Award. This award was established by David and Jean Heyd to encourage and assist deserving University students and to honor their parents, Charles and E. LaRue Wilcox and Elmer and Kathryn Heyd. It will be given to a full-time male junior who is pursuing an appropriate department of biblical education major for seminary training and who is planning to serve in the pastorate. The recipient must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.3 and demonstrate the spiritual qualifications and godly leadership skills necessary to excel in this ministry. Preference will be given to students planning to pastor in the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches.

The George L. Lawlor Greek Award. The student having the highest GPA in intermediate Greek will receive *The Exhaustive Concordance to the Greek New Testament*.

The Mary Jane LeBlanc Missions Award. This award was established by John and Jean LeBlanc in memory of John's mother, Mary Jane LeBlanc, to assist females who are preparing for full-time missionary service. Recipients must be full-time advancing junior or senior female students who have a minimum GPA of 3.3 and are preparing for full-time cross-cultural missionary service. The award will be placed on the recipient's account to defray tuition expenses.

The Oxford University Press Bible Awards. These awards recognize the graduating seniors with the highest cumulative GPAs in the world missions and preseminary Bible majors. The two senior recipients receive Parallel New Testaments.

The Marlin Rayburn Award. Established in memory of Professor Marlin Rayburn, who taught homiletics at Cedarville for 17 years, this monetary award

recognizes a student who has demonstrated excellence in homiletics. Recipients carry a minimum GPA of 3.0 and are chosen by the instructor of homiletics courses and the vice president for development.

The Zondervan/Cedarville University Greek Award. The student having the highest grade average in elementary Greek receives the *Greek English Concordance to the New Testament* and a gold medallion.

Department of Business Administration

The Amstutz Management-Sales Award. Established by Mr. and Mrs. Myron E. Amstutz, this endowed award is granted to a deserving junior majoring in business administration.

The Boyd Accounting Award. This award is presented annually to a deserving junior in accounting.

The Dr. Clifford W. Fawcett Business Faculty Senior Scholar Award. This monetary award recognizes a business senior who has demonstrated exceptional scholarship and exemplary Christian, moral, and ethical character. The recipient must be a senior in the last year of study, pursuing a bachelor's degree in business with a minimum GPA of 3.3.

The Marinus Hazen Memorial Scholarship. This cash award, established by family and friends in loving memory of "Rene," is given to full-time seniors who are pursuing a career in finance and who have a minimum GPA of 3.3. Recipients must demonstrate exceptional ethical conduct and Christian testimony.

The J.D. Cloud & Co., L.L.P. Accounting Award. This annual award, sponsored by J.D. Cloud & Co., L.L.P., is given to a student majoring in accounting who has maintained a grade point average of 3.5 or higher and is planning to pursue a career in public accounting. The recipient shall be actively involved in a leadership position with a civic, community, educational, or Christian ministry.

The Jim and Phyllis Murphy Business Award. This award was established by Jim '68 and Phyllis Ackerman Murphy '71 to aid students who are pursuing a bachelor's degree in business. Recipients must be full-time advancing sophomores and juniors with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5. The monetary award is credited to the student's account to defray tuition expenses.

The Wall Street Journal Award. This award is given to a graduating senior with excellent academic performance and potential. The recipient receives a handsome, personalized paperweight and a one-year complimentary

subscription to the *The Wall Street Journal*. The recipient's name is engraved on the school plaque with past winners of the award.

Centennial Library

The Centennial Library Scholarship in Library Science. This award has been established by the Centennial Library faculty, through the generosity of a 1997 graduate of Cedarville University, to encourage and actively support the next generation of library and information specialists, and especially to support those who will fill the future library faculty ranks of Christian colleges and universities. The cash award will be made directly to the institution in which the recipient is enrolled for graduate study in library and information science. The selection of the award recipient is made by a committee comprised of Centennial Library faculty.

Department of Communication Arts

The Miriam Maddox Speech Communication Award. This endowed scholarship award is presented annually to a communication arts freshman, sophomore, or junior who exhibits high commitment to Christian education and excellence in speech communication training.

The James R. Phipps Communication Award. This award, established by the communications arts faculty, annually recognizes an outstanding full-time junior or senior communication arts major who exemplifies the values of the department, including community involvement and Christian ministry.

The Dan Poole Broadcasting Award. This monetary award is given to a full-time student who is pursuing a bachelor's degree in broadcasting and is actively involved with the University student radio station. The recipient must have a minimum GPA of 3.3 and have at least one year of study remaining.

The Rietveld Fine Arts Award. Established by Mr. and Mrs. Floyd Rietveld, this award is given annually to the junior or senior demonstrating consistent and outstanding ability and development in one or more areas of the fine arts (music, drama, communication arts, and broadcasting). Criteria for the selection include classroom excellence, performance abilities, leadership qualities, and evidence of a life dedicated to serving and honoring the Lord Jesus Christ. The academic vice president and respective department chairs make the selection.

Department of Education

The Dr. Merlin and Mrs. Ruth Ager Education Award. The purpose of this award, funded by the department of education faculty and other interested

parties, is to recognize an outstanding senior who exemplifies the values of the department, including academic excellence, youth involvement, and Christian ministry. The recipient will be a full-time senior with a minimum GPA of 3.3 who is pursuing an academic major in education. The recipient must have an effective ongoing ministry to young people during his or her tenure at Cedarville University. Preference will be given to those students planning to teach overseas.

The Arline Littleton Autio Award. This annual award is given to a last-quarter secondary or early childhood education senior who intends to pursue a career in public school education. General and Mrs. Clyde Autio have endowed the award in loving memory of and in gratitude for the life and educational ministry of General Autio's mother, Arline Littleton Autio.

The Irma M. Dodson Award. Established by Irma M. Dodson, who served in the field of education for 50 years, this award is granted to a senior graduating in early childhood education. The recipient has demonstrated consistent and outstanding ability in daily preparation and teaching excellence during the classroom field experiences and student teaching. The recipient also has been involved in Christian service and has shown leadership qualities and scholastic ability.

The Erich W. Ebert Award. This annual award is given to a last-quarter secondary or early childhood education senior who intends to pursue a career in Christian school education. This award has been endowed by General and Mrs. Clyde Autio in loving memory of and in gratitude for the life and educational ministry of Mrs. Autio's father, Erich W. Ebert.

The Dr. Sharon Eimers Memorial Award. Established in loving memory of Dr. Sharon Eimers, who taught in the department of education for 19 years, this award recognizes and assists exceptional education majors. The recipient must be a full-time junior or senior education major with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.3. The student who receives this cash award must demonstrate exceptional creativity, enthusiasm, and dedication to teaching.

The Clara Monzelle Milner Award. This annual award for excellence is granted to a deserving junior in teacher education. This memorial has been endowed by Dr. George S. Milner.

The Donna Purple Memorial Award for Education. This award was established by the friends and family of Donna Purple to honor her memory and to assist students preparing for a career in education. The recipient must be a full-time rising junior or senior student pursuing a degree in education, preferably middle childhood education, with a minimum GPA of 3.3. Preference is given to students who are struggling with or who have overcome severe illness. A monetary award is credited to the student's account.

Elmer W. Engstrom Department of Engineering

The AFCEA Scholarship Award. The Dayton-Wright Chapter of the Armed Forces Communications and Electronics Association has sponsored scholarships for Cedarville University engineering students. Selection criteria emphasize academic performance, leadership, and involvement in electrical engineering organizations. The award includes a cash stipend.

The ASME Outstanding Student Award. This annual award recognizes significant contributions to the student section of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME) and leadership in both academics and extracurricular professional development. The award consists of an engineering instrument and an engineering tuition grant.

The Raymond P. Holland Jr. Engineering Excellence Award. This award was established by Stephen and Linda Nelson in loving memory of Linda's father, Raymond P. Holland Jr., who was an excellent father, husband, and aeronautical engineer. Recipients must be full-time advancing sophomore or junior engineering majors with a minimum GPA of 3.3. They must exhibit excellence, creativity, dedication, and common sense in their studies and application of engineering principals. This monetary award is credited to the student's account to defray tuition expenses.

The IEEE Dayton Section Outstanding Student Award. The Dayton Section of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) annually recognizes outstanding area electrical engineering students. Selection criteria emphasize academic performance balanced with spiritual maturity, activities, and leadership in engineering organizations. The award includes a cash stipend.

The Nehemiah Engineering Award. Provided by Dr. and Mrs. Eugene Apple, this award recognizes an underclass engineering student who demonstrates the balance of devotion to God and diligence of professional purpose that was projected by the life of Nehemiah. The annual award consists of an engineering tuition grant.

The Rolan David Polsdorfer Electrical Engineering Award. This award, established by Catherine Polsdorfer in loving memory of her husband, Rolan David, recognizes the academic achievements of outstanding students who are pursuing careers in the field of electrical engineering. Recipients must be full-time advancing sophomore or junior students with a minimum GPA of 3.3 and one year of study remaining in their academic programs. The monetary award is credited to the student's account to defray tuition expenses.

The SAE Outstanding Student Award. This annual award recognizes significant contributions to the student section of the Society of Automotive

Engineers (SAE) and leadership in both academics and extracurricular professional development. The award consists of an engineering instrument and an engineering tuition grant.

Department of Exercise and Sport Science

The Dave Jones Memorial Soccer Award. This endowed annual award, established by the friends and family of Dave Jones in memory of his contribution to the soccer and ministry programs, is granted to a junior or senior member of the men's soccer team. The recipient must be a full-time student with a minimum GPA of 2.5 and be an active participant in the soccer ministry/outreach program.

The Rusty King Memorial Scholarship. This endowed scholarship will be awarded annually to two students, one female and one male, who have completed at least two seasons on the cross country team. Recipients shall have achieved a grade point average of 3.3 or above and demonstrated exemplary Christian character.

The Dr. and Mrs. Duane R. Wood Awards. These endowed awards are granted annually to a full-time male and a full-time female student, sophomore or above, with a minimum GPA of 3.3. The recipients have evidenced Christian character, leadership on campus, academic achievement, and varsity athletic performance. The selection committee consists of the academic vice president, the vice president for student services, and the athletic director.

Department of Language and Literature

The Alumni Spanish Majors Scholarship. This award was established to assist students majoring in Spanish or multi-age Spanish education. Recipients must be full-time sophomore, junior, or senior students who have a minimum GPA of 3.3. Preference will be given to students who have been accepted for study abroad programs in Spanish for a summer term or semester and to those students who are active in outreach ministries. The monetary award will be credited to the student's account to defray tuition expenses.

The Anderson Family Scholarship. This award is granted to a female student who is including in her studies a concentration in a foreign language. The recipient shall have earned an overall GPA of 3.0. The award is provided by Mr. and Mrs. Robert J. Anderson Jr.

The Edith Hart Milner Award. This annual award for excellence is given to a deserving junior majoring in English literature. This award has been endowed by Dr. George S. Milner.

Department of Music

The Charles & Margaret Clevenger Piano Award. This award was established by Dr. Charles Clevenger to honor his parents, Charles E. and Margaret Clevenger, whose love and encouragement have shaped him as an artist and educator. Recipients must be full-time rising junior or senior students with a minimum GPA of 3.3 who are pursuing a degree in music with piano as principal instrument. The recipient must demonstrate exemplary musical stewardship and Christian character. The monetary award will be credited to his or her student account.

The Faculty Music Award. The Faculty Music Award is presented to the freshman music major who has best demonstrated excellence in academics, musicianship, and Christian character.

The John E. Kohl Music Award. This annual award, granted to a deserving junior majoring in music, includes a plaque recognizing excellence in musical scholarship, musical performance, and Christian service through music. This memorial has been provided by Robert Trombley.

The Madison Caroline Law Memorial Scholarship. This award was established by Randy and Meredith Johnson to award a young, Christian woman who shows gifting and true promise as a vocalist and educator. Recipients must be full-time junior or senior female students pursuing a degree in music education (vocal emphasis) and carrying a minimum GPA of 3.3. If equally qualified candidates are available, preference will be given to students who were born prematurely or who have spent a significant amount of time in the hospital as children. Recipients receive a cash award.

The Love Pedagogy Scholarship in Music. The recipient, who has completed two years at Cedarville University, is pursuing a degree in music with an emphasis in pedagogy, demonstrates excellence in pedagogy, and maintains a GPA of 3.5 or above.

The Music Contribution Award. This award is given to a graduating senior who has contributed very significantly to the department of music. The music faculty selects a recipient based on performance, service, participation, ministry, and attitude.

Outstanding Future Music Teacher Award. This award is given to the graduating senior who demonstrates exceptional potential for a successful career in music education. Qualifications include recognized teaching ability, stewardship of talent, membership in MENC (Music Educators National Conference), and well-developed professional awareness. The selection is made by the music faculty.

The Mr. and Mrs. Rolan David Polsdorfer Music Award. This award, established by Catherine Polsdorfer in loving memory of her husband, is given to a full-time advancing junior or senior who is pursuing a degree in music with piano as principal instrument. The recipient must have a minimum GPA of 3.3 and have one year of study remaining in his or her academic program. This one-time-only monetary award is credited to the recipient's account to help defray tuition expenses.

The Rietveld Fine Arts Award. (See Department of Communication Arts.)

The Spiritual Leadership Music Award. This award was established by John and Jean LeBlanc in memorial to his father, John D. LeBlanc, to assist music majors. The recipient must be a full-time junior or senior student pursuing an academic major in music. The recipient must also have a minimum GPA of 3.3 and must demonstrate increasing spiritual maturity as a musician. The student receives a monetary award credited to his or her account.

The Kristi Lynn Walborn Award. Given to a sophomore or junior music major with an emphasis in voice or in music education, this scholarship was established in memory of Kristi Lynn Walborn.

Department of Nursing

The Pat Yoder Amstutz Nursing Award. Established by Mrs. and Mrs. Myron E. Amstutz, this endowed award is granted to a deserving junior majoring in nursing.

The Kimberly Kerr Memorial Scholarship. Established in memory of Kimberly Kerr '75, this endowed fund provides scholarships to junior or senior nursing students based on scholastic achievement.

The Lillian Kresge Award. Established in memory of Lillian Kresge, a resident of Cedarville who devoted her life to a career as a Christian nurse, this fund provides a scholarship for a junior or senior nursing student based on scholastic achievement.

The Dorothy Hilma Leininger Nursing Award. This endowed annual award was established by Dr. Wayne E. Leininger in honor of his wife, Dorothy Hilma Leininger, in gratitude for her life and ministry. The award is granted to a full-time nursing student, sophomore or above, preparing to enter the nursing profession as a career missionary. The recipient demonstrates well-rounded interests and involvements, an exemplary Christian testimony, active Christian service, Christian principles, and compassion and care for others.

The Taylor Scholarship Award. Established in honor of Ruel B. and M. Ethel Taylor by their children and grandchildren, this endowed scholarship award is

granted to a full-time junior nursing student in the top ten percent of the nursing class. The recipient is committed to honoring and serving the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and is an excellent prospect for a successful career in nursing.

Department of Psychology

The Shari Boblitt Family Memorial Award. This award was established in loving memory of Shari Lynn Boblitt for the purpose of assisting a graduating Cedarville student in the pursuit of a post-graduate degree in Christian counseling. The recipient, selected by the psychology faculty, must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.3 and demonstrate the potential to excel in the field of Christian counseling. The recipient is awarded a cash stipend.

The Dolph & Brown Psychology Award. This award, formerly known as the Alton R. Brown Award, was established by Charles and Teresa Dolph to assist exceptional students who are pursuing a career in the field of psychology. The psychology department faculty will select recipients who have a minimum GPA of 3.3, at least one year remaining in their academic program, demonstrated commitment to psychology, and evidence of personal, interpersonal, and spiritual development. This one-time-only monetary award is credited to the recipient's account.

The C. Eugene Walker, Ph.D., Psychology Award. This award, provided by C. Eugene Walker, Ph.D., is granted to a full-time junior or senior pursuing an academic major in psychology or applied psychology who has a minimum GPA of 3.3 and has demonstrated outstanding achievement in psychological studies and activities. The recipient must demonstrate a commitment to the field of psychology as evidenced by definite plans for graduate education in psychology, and he or she must be involved in a Christian ministry activity.

Department of Science and Mathematics

The AuSable Fellowship. The recipient of this award must demonstrate a strong commitment to Christian stewardship of the creation, as well as interest and leadership potential in environmental studies. Holding sophomore or higher status, the recipient plans to enroll at the AuSable Institute (Mancelona, Michigan) for the summer.

The CRC Press Chemistry Award. The current edition of the *Handbook of Chemistry and Physics* is presented to the student with the highest average for the year in general chemistry.

The Creation Research Awards. These awards are presented to outstanding seniors majoring in adolescent and young adult licensure programs (AYA) in

life science, physical science, and mathematics; biology; chemistry; computer science; mathematics; and physics. The recipient receives membership in the Creation Research Society, a subscription to the *Creation Research Quarterly*, the book *Creation and Change* by Douglas Kelly, a certificate of recognition, and a monetary cash award.

The Heyd Math/Science Award. This award was established by David and Jean Heyd to encourage and assist deserving University students and to honor their parents, Charles and E. LaRue Wilcox and Elmer and Kathryn Heyd. The award is given to full-time sophomore or junior students who are pursuing a degree within the department of science and mathematics. Recipients must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.3 and must demonstrate a balance between devotion and service to God and diligence in their academic studies. The recipients are given a monetary award.

The Patterson College Chemistry Award. Sponsored by the Dayton Section of the American Chemical Society, this monetary award is given to an outstanding junior chemistry major.

The Roloff Incentive Award. This scholarship, endowed by Dr. Marston Val Roloff, is awarded to a full-time student who has completed at least one year at Cedarville University. The recipient shall be actively involved in community service or other highly desirable leadership roles. The award is given to a student pursuing an academic program in biological sciences, and preference shall be given to children and other descendants of Cedarville University graduates.

The Undergraduate Award for Achievement in Organic Chemistry. This award recognizes outstanding achievement by a chemistry major in the organic chemistry courses.

Department of Social Sciences and History

The Edmund Burke Award. This award is given to a student majoring in the social sciences with a 3.5 or higher grade point average.

The Jenna Lynn Ellis Award. Endowed by Jenna Lynn Ellis '06, this award recognizes the academic achievements of students preparing to practice law. Recipients must be full-time junior or senior students with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.3 who are pursuing a career in law and planning to attend law school following completion of their undergraduate program. Preference is given to students planning to serve in a branch of law relating to victim advocacy or criminal prosecution. Recipients must demonstrate exceptional integrity in their academic, personal, and spiritual life and must complete an essay application explaining their definition of justice, their motivation for

pursuing a career in law, and their ethical responsibilities within their expected field of practice. Junior recipients receive a monetary award credited to their account to defray current tuition expenses. Graduating seniors are issued a check made payable to the law school of their choosing.

The Dr. Joseph Halsey Award. This annual scholarship is awarded to a full-time student pursuing an academic major in political science who anticipates entering law school after completing his or her program of study. He or she must have at least one year remaining in his or her program of study. The recipient must demonstrate the potential to excel in the political science program. This scholarship is provided by a Cedarville alumnus who majored in political science.

Other Awards

The Harold R. Green Christian Ministries Awards. These awards are given by the Division of Christian Ministries in honor of Dr. Harold R. Green for his 25 years of faithful service to our Lord through his work with the Division. The awards are given to graduating seniors who have shown faithfulness and leadership in the area of Christian ministry.

The John W. Bickett Heritage Alumni Scholarships. Established by the Heritage Alumni, these awards are named for the Reverend John Wilson Bickett, the first member of the first graduating class to receive a diploma from Cedarville. The recipients are junior or senior students preparing for pastoral or missionary service and planning to further their education in seminary or language studies.

The James T. Jeremiah Award. This award was established by the administration to honor Dr. James T. Jeremiah for his many years of faithful service to Cedarville College. The recipient must be a senior desiring to enter a full-time pastoral ministry. The recipient must possess outstanding character qualities and be active in Christian ministries. Selection is made by the vice president for Christian ministries and the Bible faculty.

The Ruby Jeremiah Scholarship. This award was established by the female faculty of Cedarville University to honor Mrs. Ruby Jeremiah for more than 25 years of service to Cedarville and to continue her interest and support of married women completing their education at Cedarville University. The recipient must be a full-time junior or senior married woman with a minimum GPA of 3.0. She must be active in Christian service and student life. The steering committee of the scholarship fund makes the selection.

Graduation With Honor

A student who earns a grade point average of 3.50 will be graduated with honor; one who earns a grade point average of 3.75 will be graduated with high honor; and one who earns a grade point average of 3.90 will be graduated with highest honor. A student must be in residence at least two full years (61 semester hours) in order to qualify for honors. Hours earned by examination (test-out) do not count as hours in residence toward graduation with honors.

The following May graduates qualify for graduation with honor as of the end of Fall Semester 2003.

The Academic Regalia

The colorful academic regalia dates from the Middle Ages when European universities took form. Academic costume has been in use in the United States since colonial times and is traditionally used for graduation convocations. An intercollegiate commission was formed which established the following standard of uniformity for caps, gowns, and hoods.

The standard cap is a mortarboard. The tassel color indicates the subject field.

The length of the hood and the width of the velvet indicates the level of the degree. The doctor's hood is quite long, has two tails, and has a five-inch wide velvet. The master's hood is shorter than the doctor's and has a three-inch wide velvet. The bachelor's hood is shorter yet and has a two-inch wide velvet. The color of the velvet indicates the field of study. Blue velvet indicates the doctoral degrees. The dark brown velvet indicates the master of arts degree. White velvet indicates the bachelor of arts or the master of arts degree. Scarlet velvet indicates the bachelor of divinity degree or the master of divinity degree. Yellow indicates the bachelor of science degree. The colors in the lining of the hood are the university colors.

The gown's traditional color is black. The distinguishing feature of the master's gown is the tippet sleeve. The doctor's gown has two distinguishing features. It is cut much fuller than the bachelor's or the master's gown and has velvet panels on the sleeves, around the neck, and down the front. These panels may be black or the color which symbolizes the subject field in which the degree was earned.
