Mindy Ackley, a former standout runner and 1983 graduate of Hart High School, is in her first year as a member of the Cedarville (OH) College women's cross country team. Mindy is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Calvin Ackley of Route 1, Harrison Road in Mears. A freshman at the college this fall, Mindy is majoring in business.

Ackley has been running in the number two position on the varsity this year. Coach Elvin King commented, "Mindy is a very consistent runner. She runs a solid race, from start to finish and she sets a consistent pace." Ackley made the NCCAA District III team when she placed fourth in the district meet to help lead C.C. to the team title. Her best time this year in the 3.1 mile distance is 20:06.

The Yellow Jackets possess the best women's cross country team in the school's history this year even though the women's program was only started four years ago. Cedarville has already won one invitational and finished second in another. The Jackets will host the national meet for the National Christian College Athletic Association on November 12. The team has an excellent opportunity to also qualify for the NAIA Nationals which will be run a week later in Kenosha, Wisconsin.

Cedarville is a Baptist, liberal arts college located in southwestern Ohio, 25 miles east of Dayton. The school has an enrollment of approximately 1800 students.
