Beth Britton, a former runner and 1980 graduate of Kingston High School, is in her senior year as a member of the Cedarville (OH) College women's cross country team. Beth is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Britton of 3833 S. Plain Road in Kingston and she carries a Biology/Secondary Education major. Britton is the captain of the team this fall and Coach Elvin King stated, "Beth has done an outstanding job in helping with the team this year and she has emerged as an excellent leader of the squad."

The Yellow Jackets possess the best women's cross country team in the school's history this year even though the women's program was only started four years ago. Cedarville has already won one invitational and finished second in another. The Jackets will host the national meet for the National Christian College Athletic Association on November 12. The team has an excellent opportunity to also qualify for the NAIA Nationals which will be run a week later in Kenosha, Wisconsin.
