THREE CEDARVILLE ATHLETES EARN NAIA ALL-AMERICA HONORS

AZUSA, California -- Three Cedarville College athletes earned All-America status at the NAIA National Track and Field Championships at Azusa Pacific University (Calif.). The top six finishers in each event are considered All-Americans.

Stephanie Sherman, a junior from Watertown, N.Y., placed second in the triple jump with a school-record leap of 40-feet 10 1/4-inches. Sherman, who won the event as a freshman two years ago, is now an eight-time NAIA All-American -- three times in the outdoor triple jump, three times in the indoor triple jump, and twice in the indoor long jump.

Two Yellow Jacket men finished in the top six of their respective events led by Chad Eder who was third in the 5,000 meter race walk. The sophomore from Kennewick, Wash. had a time of 21:33. Cincinnati native Joe Cunningham, also a sophomore, was sixth in the pole vault after clearing 15-feet 11 3/4-inches.
