Sandy O'Boyle, a former runner and 1983 graduate of Breckenridge High School, is in her first year as a member of the Cedarville (OH) College women's cross country team. Sandy is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Gerald O'Boyle of 7905 Mason Road in Merrill. A freshman at the college this fall, Sandy carries a nursing major.

O'Boyle has been running in the number four position on the varsity this year and since the first meet, she has lowered her best time by over a minute. Coach Elvin King commented, "Sandy has shown the most improvement over everyone else on the team and that has really strengthened us." O'Boyle made the NCCAA District III team when she placed sixth in the district meet to help lead C.C. to the team title. That day she ran the 3.1 mile distance in a personal best time of 21:05.

The Yellow Jackets possess the best women's cross country team in the school's history this year even though the women's program was only started four years ago. Cedarville has already won one invitational and finished second in another. The Jackets will host the national meet for the National Christian College Athletic Association on November 12. The team has an excellent opportunity to also qualify for the NAIA Nationals which will be run a week later in Kenosha, Wisconsin.

Cedarville is a Baptist, liberal arts college located in southwestern Ohio, 25 miles east of Dayton. The school has an enrollment of approximately 1800 students.
