## CU's Patterson part of USA baseball gold medal team

Steve Patterson, an assistant professor in the Exercise and Sport Science Department at Cedarville University, served as the Head Athletic Trainer this past summer for the United States national 16U baseball team. It was his ninth year to work with USA Baseball and his third overseas trip with the program. This summer's championship was held in Taichung, Taiwan.

After a week-long training camp and selection process for the team in southern California at Cal State-Fullerton, the group headed off for a three-week stay in Taiwan. The World Championship event consisted of team's from 12 nations competing in opening round pool play.

After going undefeated in pool action, USA faced the host Taiwan team in the quarterfinals and posted an 11-8 come-from-behind victory scoring 11 straight runs after the fourth inning.

A defeat of Mexico in the semifinals placed the USA squad against the powerful Cuba team - a matchup of two undefeated teams. The USA squad found themselves trailing 5-3 in the seventh inning before staging an incredible comeback to win the game 7-6 in the ninth inning and capture the 16U Baseball World Championship.

Patterson notes his passion for this group, "I have loved being part of this great organization over the last few years and it has been a thrill to work with some amazing athletes." He shares an observation that one of the most exciting things to see happen is young men coming together from all parts of the United States (even Ohio - Austin Cousino from Dublin Coffman High School) and unite for one purpose of representing the United States.

Patterson, who also serves as the Athletic Training Education Program Director at CU, adds, "I like to encourage all of my Cedarville athletic training students that they can have an impact on others no matter what venue they find themselves. Athletic training provides so many opportunities to make a difference in people's lives."

"You don't have to beat someone over the head with the Bible for them to see Christ in you. Everyone on the team was able to see Christ in my heart. I had many opportunities to pray with players and encourage them through some challenging times."

"It was a great experience and one I will never forget!", he exclaimed.

Congratulations on your retirement, Coach and Mrs. Coach!

# Thanks from a CU parent.....



Late for a game our daughter's freshman year, we dashed into a McDonald's somewhere near Cleveland, hoping to grab a burger to eat in the car. Hastily, we gave our order to the manager, not even realizing that our Yellow Jackets t-shirts were somewhat visible under our unbuttoned coats. The very tall manager chattily said, "Yellow Jackets! Now what Yellow Jackets would those be?" With our focus still on speed, we quickly said, "Oh, a Christian college near Dayton." To our surprise, the manager said, "That wouldn't be Cedarville University, would it?" Surprised, we nodded.

"Oh Cedarville! How we loved to play there. You see, I played basketball for Rio Grande. Playing at Cedarville was always the highlight of our season. The fans there were always so kind to us. There was just a warmth and a friendly spirit from the moment our bus would pull on campus." As the anxious line of patrons grew behind us, the manager got a far away look in his eye as he continued to rhapsodize. "That was over ten years ago, but I remember it so fondly."

As we left the McDonald's, he proudly told us, "I super-sized your orders. It's not much, but it's the most I can do. I hope your daughter's team plays well." We left the restaurant that night feeling like winners. We were delighted that our daughter was part of a school that so lived out its faith, that the testimony of Christ would linger in a visitor's memory even ten years later. What an impact! What a testimony!

And that was just our introduction to athletics at Cedarville. We have nothing but great appreciation for four memorable years spent as part of the Cedarville sports family. Our daughter had the Godliest coaches who took care to nurture her physically, spiritually, and academically. Her freshman year, her coach (also an M.D.) even helped her with her pre-med classes the many hours they spent on the buses and in gyms.

And as parents, we too learned that Cedarville is distinctly Christian. Having grown up in Christian schools, having played for a Christian college, and having coached in Christian schools, it is not unusual to hear or yell an, "Ah come on ref!" when an exceedingly bad call is made. We quickly learned that Cedarville parents and fans don't protest bad calls. A knee slap is the most we've observed. In fact, the volleyball players themselves volunteer if they've accidentally touched the net or tipped a ball going out. We've witnessed games lost because our team volunteered an "honor call." The game was lost, but the respect gained among those watching was a victory.

What a thrill it was to see CU players, after an intense game, hand out Good News Bibles and tracts to referees and players. The players easily earned the respect of the officials and other players. How often we saw opponents walk to their lockers, thumbing through their recently received gifts. And it was also a special joy to see the Cedarville team invite the opponents and officials to pray after each match. The women's volleyball team also had a fruitful time overseas, using the platform of athletics to point people to Christ.

As parents, we often received compliments from others in the stands, "I love how your coaches are always so positive. We've watched them carefully. They never lose their cool and always treat players with such respect."

The women's volleyball team has won two NCCAA national championships during our four years as Jacket fans. We've formed close bonds with the other parents. We are a tight knit group—and we will miss them. No wonder parents of graduates continue to show up to games. We'll have to perpetuate that tradition.

I know that there is often the perception that too much money is wasted on athletics. That is not the case at Cedarville University. Their athletes are phenomenal ambassadors of Jesus Christ. If only each of us as Christians left the same lingering "sweet smelling aroma" of Christ on those around us. And the beauty is that many of Cedarville's athletes will go on to coach in schools all across our land and around the world. They will be modeling what they've learned—and making disciples of Jesus Christ.



# End of an Era at Cedarville University

**E**lvin King, the only coach to lead a Cedarville University athletic team to an NAIA national title, stepped down as head coach of the Lady Jacket cross country program following the 2009 season. He will also retire from the Department of Exercise and Sport Science at the end of the academic year where he carries the title of Associate Professor.

"The best explanation is that it's just the right time for me," King stated. "I've been at Cedarville for 41 years and the Lord has blessed me immensely. My wife (Joyce) and I have talked about it for awhile and we're still looking forward to helping out the athletics program however we can."

King has been associated with the Yellow Jacket distance running program since coming to Cedarville in 1969 and he's the only coach that Cedarville's highly-regarded women's cross country team has ever had. He started the women's track and cross country programs in 1979, but he devoted his coaching full-time to women's cross country since 2002 after previously coaching track as well as men's cross country.

"We certainly appreciate all that Elvin has done for cross country and track not only at Cedarville, but throughout the state and the nation," remarked athletic director Dr. Alan Geist. "We will miss his influence on the women's cross country program and on our athletic department."

Geist added that King will fulfill his responsibilities through the season and that the University is considering its options on how to fill the position.

The biggest highlight of King's coaching career occurred in 2001 when Cedarville captured the NAIA national championship and he was voted National Coach of the Year. It remains the only NAIA title that any Yellow Jacket team has ever won.

The women, who were ranked as high as #2 in the country in 2009, have been the NAIA runner-up in 2006, 2007, and 2008. They garnered their ninth NCCAA championship banner and fourth in a row in 2009. The Lady Jackets also claimed the American Midwest Conference championship seven of the past 10 seasons.

Cedarville added yet another remarkable achievement to its decorated history in 2008. The Lady Jackets won the All-Ohio Intercollegiate Championship which includes all of the state's major colleges and universities. CU became the first NAIA school to win the trophy.

The Lady Jackets have been ranked among the NAIA's Top 20 cross country programs in each of the last 18 years including stints at the No. 1 spot during the 2001, 2002, and 2008 campaigns. They have posted ten straight NAIA Top 10 finishes.

King received a rare honor during CU's Homecoming Weekend in 2006. In recognition of his dedicated commitment to Cedarville University, the school's new home distance running venue was named the Elvin R. King Cross Country Course.

King has been a frontrunner in the National Christian College Athletic Association. He is responsible for developing the NCCAA Track & Field Championships and he has played a key role in

Cedarville hosting the NCCAA Cross Country Championships for the 30th time in the past 32 years including last Nov. 14.

King's teams have won a combined 18 NCCAA track and cross country titles. Equally as impressive is that on 16 occasions one of his runners has been presented the Wheeler Award (men) or the Bullock Award (women) which is symbolic of the NCCAA's Athlete of the Year in either track or cross country.

King's efforts earned him induction into the Cedarville University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1988, the NCCAA Hall of Fame in 1993, and the NAIA Hall of Fame in 2005. He has won numerous Coach of the Year Awards in the NAIA, NCCAA, the American Midwest Conference, and the Mid-Ohio Conference.

He was the Ohio Intercollegiate Cross Country Association's selection for the coveted Marv Frye Award in 2009 for his contributions to cross country in the Buckeye state. He is also a past president of the OICCA.

Elvin and his wife, Joyce, who was inducted into the Cedarville University Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003 for her meritorious service to Yellow Jacket athletics, reside in Cedarville. They have two children and four grandchildren.

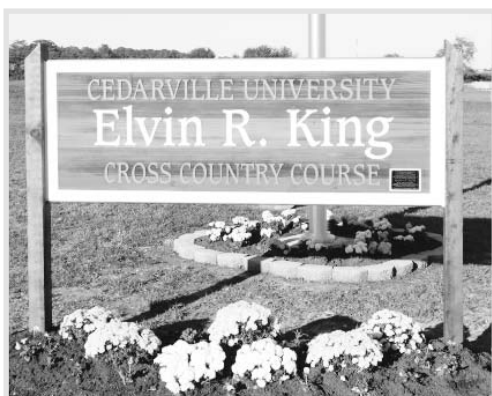

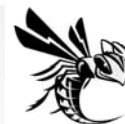

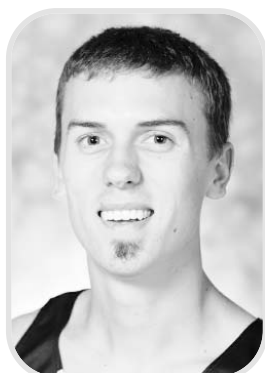
