Becky Averill, a former runner and 1983 graduate of New Hampton High School, is in her freshman year as a member of the Cedarville (OH) College women's cross country team. Becky is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Averill of R.R. 1 in New Hampton.

Averill had been running in the number five position on the varsity this fall until a sprained ankle slowed her down a bit. Coach Elvin King said, "Becky is making a comeback and we hope she hits full stride again before our big meets at the end of the season." Averill's best time thus far in the 3.1 mile distance is 20:28.

The Yellow Jackets possess the best women's cross country team in the school's history this year even though the women's program was only started four years ago. Cedarville has already won one invitational and finished second in another. The Jackets will host the national meet for the National Christian College Athletic Association on November 12. The team has an excellent opportunity to also qualify for the NAIA Nationals which will be run a week later in Kenosha, Wisconsin.

Cedarville is a Baptist, liberal arts college located in southwestern Ohio, 25 miles east of Dayton. The school has an enrollment of approximately 1800 students.
