## TWO FORMER INDIANS RUNNING AT CEDARVILLE

Two Cedarville High School graduates have played significant roles on this fall's Cedarville College women's and men's cross country teams. Beth McGillivray and Rusty King have been running on their respective varsity squads all season long. The Yellow Jackets are currently ranked 18th in the NAIA in both the women's and men's divisions.

McGillivray is a junior English major at the college and she has consistently been the cross country team's number five runner. Beth placed 13th last weekend in the Lady Jackets runner-up showing in the NAIA District 22 meet. Her lowest time of the year came in the Anderson (IN) Invitational when she covered the 5,000 meters in 20:26. Beth is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John McGillivray of 70 Center Street in Cedarville.

King was an NCCAA All-American last fall and he has been one of the Jackets top five runners this year. His best time of the season thus far was a 25:55 clocking in the big All-Ohio Meet at OSU. King placed sixth in the team's win at the Rio Grande Invitational, and he was 15th in the squad's runner-up finish at the Hanover (IN) Invitational where C.C. lost to Purdue. Rusty carries a Physical Education major and is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Elvin King of 58 Center Street in Cedarville.
