CEDARVILLE -- Chris Friesen and Joy Fagan, both members of the Cedarville College women's basketball team, have been named to select All-Academic teams for the 1988-89 season.

Friesen, a 5-foot-8 senior from Redding, Cal., has been selected to the NAIA Women's Basketball Scholar-Athlete team. She led the Lady Jackets to a best-ever 20-10 record by averaging 17.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game, plus she carries a 3.46 grade point average as a mathematics major.

Friesen finished her career as the Lady Jackets' second all-time leading scorer and rebounder with 1,441 points and 921 rebounds. Chris is Cedarville's first basketball player, male or female, to be named an NAIA Scholar-Athlete. Forty-three players in all were named to the women's team.

Friesen was also voted to the GTE CoSIDA Academic All-District IV College Division basketball team for the second year in a row. The team, which is selected by members of the College Sports Information Directors of America, includes players from Ohio, Michigan, Kentucky, Tennessee, and Alabama.

Both Friesen and Fagan, also a senior, were named to the National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) Academic All-America squad. Fagan averaged 15.0 points and 5.4 assists, plus maintains a 3.64 GPA as an English major.
