CEDARVILLE, OHIO -- Dawn Phillips and Amy Zehr, both graduates of Blackhawk Christian High School, are members of the women's varsity basketball team at Cedarville College in Ohio.

Phillips, a junior forward, has appeared in 9 of 12 games for the Yellow Jackets with four starts. She is third on the team in scoring at 6.1 points per game while shooting 50 percent from the field.

Phillips has hit double figures in scoring three times and her top outing came at Wilmington College where she totalled 17 points and 9 rebounds. Dawn is a Physical Education major at Cedarville and is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Roy Phillips of Fort Wayne.

Zehr, a freshman center, has played in 11 games with 28 points scored while shooting 54.5 percent from the field. She had 7 points and 7 rebounds in the team's most recent game at the University of Findlay.

Zehr was a standout at Blackhawk Christian where she averaged 21 points per game her senior year. She scored 1,035 points in her career and was twice named her team's MVP. Amy is the daughter of Mr. Joe Zehr and Mrs. Jan Haigh of Fort Wayne.

Cedarville has struggled out to a 3-9 start through games of Jan. 16. Nine of the Yellow Jackets' 14 players are freshmen and four rookies have consistently been in the

starting line-up. Coach Bob Fires lost four starters and nearly 50 points per game from last year's 20-10 club.

Cedarville is a Baptist liberal arts college located in southwestern Ohio, 25 miles east of Dayton. The school has an enrollment of approximately 1900 students.
