Head Coach John McGillivray

John McGillivray begins his tenth year as the head coach of the Cedarville College soccer team and in that time period he has compiled an overall 84-65-7 record. He has guided the Yellow Jackets to three outright Mid-Ohio Conference championships ('74, '75, '79), two co-championships ('78, '82), and one tri-championship ('81). The squad has won three NAIA District 22 titles ('74, '76, '78) under his leadership with the 1974 team also winning the NAIA Area IV crown to advance to the national tournament where it placed sixth. McGillivray has enjoyed successful seasons in the NCCAA gaining District III championships in 1974 and 1981 with the latter culminating in finishing as the runner-up at the NCCAA Nationals.

After graduating from Cedarville College in 1970, McGillivray returned to his alma mater in 1974. While at the school he earned his M.S. in Education from the University of Dayton in 1976. When McGillivray joined the athletic department he had never before coached soccer until Dr. Don Callan (athletic director) talked him into taking the vacant position. Through attending coaching clinics plus hard work and study, McGillivray has developed into one of the best coaches that Cedarville has ever had. He has been honored by his peers as the NAIA District 22 Coach of the Year three times ('74, '75, '78) and the NAIA Area IV Coach of the Year in 1974.

John and his wife Bonnie have five children: Beth, 17, who is a freshman at Cedarville this fall; Scott, 16; Jenny, 13; Joey, 11; and Steven, 8.

Jackets Have Spots to Fill

Cedarville College soccer coach John McGillivray began fall practice this season knowing that he would be missing ten lettermen from a year ago, as well as knowing that a rough schedule loomed ahead. But with the return of eight experienced players, the Yellow Jackets have hopes of putting together another winning season.

The kickers will get a good idea of what's waiting for them after opening up at Denison on September 14 because the road will not get any smoother. The Cedarville Invitational will be strong, not to mention other top opponents that dot the schedule like the University of Dayton, Ohio Wesleyan, Wright State, Northern Kentucky, and Wilmington. Also, the Mid-Ohio Conference competition is getting more and more balanced as the years go by.

Heading the list of Yellow Jacket returnees is senior captain DAVE JONES who has lettered the last three years and started the last two at midfield. McGillivray commented, "Dave is a hard worker, he's steady, and he is our most experienced player coming back." Sophomore TOM FITE returns after making the NAIA District 22 second team as a frosh even though he missed six games with mononucleosis. One of Cedarville's better players, Fite carries a wealth of potential.

The returning leading scorer on the '83 squad is junior forward WAYNE ANDERSON who scored 13 points on 5 goals and 3 assists last season. "Wayne got off to a good start last year and scored some key goals. He possesses a good sense for the goal at all times," says McGillivray. Sophomore forward NOEL HACK scored more goals in '82, with 6, than any other returnee, and he also netted all of the Jackets MOC goals. Both he and Anderson will be expected to pick up some of the slack left by Mark Price and Steve Smith who were 1-2 in scoring last season.

Other key players coming back include senior back PHIL MILLER who last played at Cedarville in 1981 when the Yellow Jackets were the NCCAA Runner-Up. Senior BOBBY SHOMO has had three years of varsity experience while junior back CHUCK ABEL is the only player who played in all 18 games a year ago. Sophomore KURT WEISENFLUH should fill Jim Hust's vacant position at midfield while BILL JAQUIS has moved to goalkeeper following the loss of both keepers from last season.

There will be plenty of new faces in the line-up during the 1983 campaign. And it will take good performances from those people as well if the Jackets hope to make it to post-season action again.
