UKRAINE CRISIS TO BE DISCUSSED BY EXPERT PANEL
International Effects of Ukraine Situation to Be Explored at Cedarville

CEDARVILLE, OHIO – A panel discussion of Ukraine’s political unrest will be presented March 25 at Cedarville University by student organizations Epsilon Pi Lambda and College Republicans. The event is open to the public 7-8:30 p.m. in Room 104 of the Center for Biblical and Theological Studies.

Former diplomat Frank Jenista, Ph.D., one of the panelists and a professor of international studies, said the situation in Ukraine raises questions about the future for many nations. “The whole world is asking how the rules have changed and what this means for everyone’s peace and security,” Jenista said.

Additional panelists include Glen Duerr, Ph.D., assistant professor of international studies at Cedarville, and Liam Anderson, Ph.D., associate professor of political science at Wright State University. A question and answer session will follow the panel presentation.

Rebecca Brumbaugh, president of the student history and government organization Epsilon Pi Lambda, said the panelists will help audience members develop a more critical understanding of the situation in Ukraine and how it affects the international community. “People don’t always understand how much our nation is impacted by what happens outside of it,” Brumbaugh said.

Because the discussion will focus on looking ahead, Brumbaugh said guests will benefit from background knowledge of recent events. If audience members are informed, Brumbaugh said the presentation will take them beyond news updates to a better understanding of the ramifications.
