CEDARVILLE, OHIO -- Cedarville College junior Dave Kohlmeyer has been named to the NAIA Scholar-Athlete soccer team for the 1989 season. He was one of 50 players from across the country to earn the honor. Dave, who is a graduate of Wheaton Christian High School, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. James Kohlmeyer of 214 Wakeman Ave. in Wheaton.

To be eligible for a spot on the NAIA Scholar-Athlete soccer team, a player must be at least a junior who plays a key role on the varsity team, plus carry a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.40.

Kohlmeyer easily met the criteria as a Computer Information Systems major at Cedarville. He was also the Yellow Jackets leading scorer for the third straight year by tallying 7 goals and an assist for 15 points. The team had a 7-8 record.

Kohlmeyer was named to the All-Mid-Ohio Conference first team as a forward. He was also selected to the All-NAIA District 22 second team.

Another Wheaton Christian graduate, Linda Bean, was a starter for the best women's volleyball team that Cedarville has ever had. The Yellow Jackets posted a school record for victories during a 34-13 season and they made the NAIA District 22 playoffs. Linda, who is a junior majoring in Physical Education, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Gerald Bean of West Chicago.

Bean played in 46 of 47 matches for Cedarville and specialized in back row play. She rated second on the team in service aces with 49 and was fourth in digs with 308. Linda is active during the winter quarter as a member of Cedarville's student-trainer program.

Cedarville is a Baptist liberal arts college located in southwestern Ohio, 25 miles east of Dayton. The school has an enrollment of approximately 1900 students.
