**Jun Kim** has conducted orchestras such as the State Symphony Orchestra of Russia, the St. Petersburg State Symphony Orchestra, the Moscow Symphony Orchestra in Russia, Pitesti philharmonic in Romania, Radom Chamber Orchestra in Poland, Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra in Canada, Baltimore Chamber Orchestra, and Richmond Symphony Orchestra in USA at Conducting Masterclasses. He has been selected as a Discovery Series Conductor at the Oregon Bach Festival under Maestro Helmuth Rilling. Kim has participated at the National Arts Center of Canada Conducting program and was personally selected by Maestro Kurt Masur for the Kurt Masur conducting seminar in New York. He has worked with Dmitru Goia at the Opera conducting masterclass with the production of Verdi's La Traviata in Bucharest, Romania. He was a scholarship recipient at the Pierre Monteux School for Conductors and Conductor's retreat at Medomak. He will be returning to conducted the Duluth Superior Symphony Orchestra in May 2011. Jun Kim has worked under the Maestros such as Jorma Panula, Michael Jinbo, Mark Gorenstein, Kenneth Kiesler, Markand Thaker, Xian Zhang, and Gustav Meier. Mr. Kim has degrees from Peabody Conservatory, Indiana University and University of Cincinnati CCM. Since 2006 Jun Kim has served as an assistant professor of violin and director of the University Orchestra at Cedarville University. In addition to his duties at Cedarville University, he is the music director of the Springfield Youth Symphony Orchestra.

**Catherine Stampfli** is a senior vocal performance major from Greenville, Illinois and studies with Beth Porter and Taylor Ferranti. She has been a member of Concert Chorale, Opera Ensemble, and was selected to be a soloist with the Jazz Band this year. A winner of Cedarville's Garcia vocal scholarship, Catherine has also placed or won her category at The National Association of Teachers of Singing student auditions over the last four years. Last summer, Miss Stampfli was selected to participate in The Oberlin in Italy opera program. This summer she will marry CU alumni, Mr. John Carey.

**Julia Hodecker** is a sophomore from Oregon majoring in violin performance. She began studying violin at age 6 with Diane Allen. Since the age of 12, she has received multiple Young Artist Scholarships from the Sunriver Music Festival. In high school, she was selected to perform in both All-State and All-Northwest Honors Orchestras. She was also a member of the Central Oregon Symphony from 2006 until her graduation in 2009. She was a second place winner of Cedarville's Gabrieli instrumental scholarship. Julia currently studies violin with Professor Jun Kim.
