HACK NAMED NAIA ACADEMIC SOCCER ALL-AMERICAN

The NAIA National Office recently announced that Cedarville College's Noel Hack was one of four juniors to make the 22-member NAIA Academic All-America soccer team for 1984. The Lagrange native carries a 3.85 grade point average as a pre-seminary Bible major. Hack is a 1982 graduate of the Elyria Christian Academy and is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Noel F. Hack of Lagrange.

Nominees must be a junior or senior varsity performer that has at least a cumulative grade point average of 3.40 on a 4.0 scale. All nominees must demonstrate a proficiency in soccer as a varsity letterman and regular starter in the season of the nomination.

Hack garnered two other honors this year. He was named to the first team in both the Mid-Ohio Conference and NAIA District 22.

Hack was a co-captain of the Yellow Jackets this fall and he was named the team's MVP. He helped the kickers to an 11-8-1 record and a berth in the NCCAA (National Christian College Athletic Association) Nationals. Hack was the team's second-leading scorer from his forward position with 36 points on 12 goals and 12 assists.

Cedarville is a Baptist liberal arts college located 25 miles east of Dayton. The school has an enrollment of approximately 1800 students.
