1996-97 NAIA WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD SCHOLAR-ATHLETES ANNOUNCED

TULSA, Okla. – Here are the 1996-97 NAIA Women's Track & Field All-America Scholar-Athletes as selected by the NAIA Women's Track & Field All-America Scholar-Athlete Committee. Sixty-one student-athletes were selected this year for this honor.

To be selected as an NAIA Women's Track & Field All-America Scholar-Athlete, the nominee must be a junior or above academically and a varsity performer, certified by her institution's registrar as a full-time student. She must also have been in attendance at least one term at the nominating institution prior to the institution submitting the nomination. The honoree must have minimum 3.50 grade point average (on a 4.0 scale) as defined by the nominating institution. She must have also demonstrated a proficiency in the sport of track and field by meeting certain defined qualifying standards.
