Klebe, Folkl Tops on GTE Academic Volleyball

Tanya Klebe of Rochester and Kristin Folkl of Stanford were selected as the Team Members of the Year in their respective divisions on the 1997 GTE Academic All-America® Volleyball Team.

Klebe, senior from Yuba City, Calif., maintained a perfect 4.00 grade point average while majoring in mechanical engineering. She helped her team to a 26-17 record and a berth in the NCAA playoffs.

Folkl, senior from St. Louis, has a 3.46 GPA and a major in economics. She helped guide her squad into the NCAA Division I playoffs.

On the college-division first team with Klebe are Kelly Englebrecht of Augustana (III.), Lori Janssen of Grand Valley State, Kim Koelling of Nebraska Wesleyan, Christy Molitor of St. Benedict and Elvira Vakhidova of Barry.

Englebrecht had a perfect 4.00 GPA along with Klebe. Four of the college division second team members had 4.00 GPAs and five on the third unit had perfect grade point averages.


