

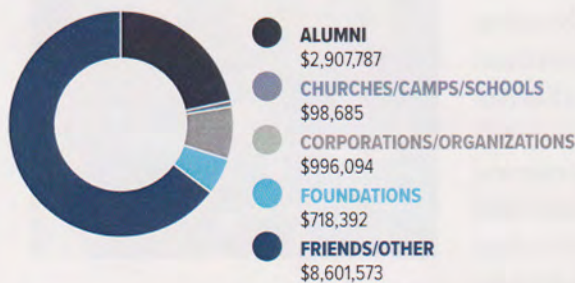

INVESTING IN FUTURE MINISTRY



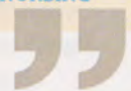

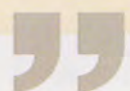

KINGDOM DIVERSITY TEAM



This fall, Cedarville instituted a new Kingdom Diversity Team to advance the biblical value of diversity on our campus. The team is made up of students, faculty, and staff from across campus and is responsible for planning diversity-related events and recommending policy changes to promote diversity. This fall, the team held the first-ever Prayer Service for Racial Unity and recommended establishing the new Dr. Deforia Lane Diversity Scholarship, named in honor of a longtime board member.

CARING WELL DURING COVID



This fall, faculty, staff, and students joined together to deliver meals to students who were either in quarantine or isolation. Students were able to order online from a custom menu each evening and meals were delivered to their residence halls the next day for breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Our students are well prepared to excel in their chosen career field, but also to use their vocations to impact the world for Christ.

NEW GRADUATE PROGRAMS

Starting January 2021, The Graduate School is offering two new graduate degrees: the Master of Arts in Biblical Leadership and the Master of Arts in Worship and Theology. Both programs are offered in a convenient online format and will equip students with the theological training and practical skills to expand their service or add a ministry focus to their vocation. An online, four-course Graduate Certificate in Worship Leadership is also available.

NEW CYBER OPERATIONS MAJOR

Adding to our already strong cybersecurity curriculum, the School of Engineering and Computer Science began offering a cyber operations major in fall 2020. This program will equip graduates with the technical skills and biblical worldview to be effective and ethical professionals in the growing cybersecurity. Cedarville University has been certified as a National Center for Academic Excellence in Cyber Operations (CAE-CO), making Cedarville part of an elite group of institutions to receive this designation.

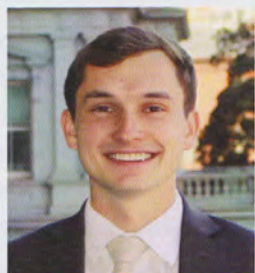

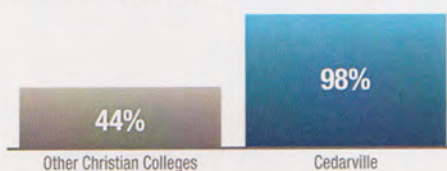

CU GIVE HOPE FUND



In March, like most colleges and universities across the nation, we had to send our students home due to the coronavirus pandemic to finish their semester online. Along with the disappointment of missing friends and special events on campus, for many of our students, the pandemic meant unexpected financial hardships. We asked our Cedarville family to come together to help students financially impacted by COVID-19 through the CU Give Hope Fund, and you came through in a big way. In a single day of giving, we received \$314,385, which provided emergency scholarships for 294 students. Many of these students would not have been able to return this fall without this extra assistance. Thank you for giving hope to our students when they needed it most.

CHICK-FIL-A EXPANDS DINING OPTIONS



In August, we officially opened our new Chick-fil-A facility, a day we had been looking forward to for several years. We are so grateful to the Lord for the blessing of this new facility, made possible through generous donor support.

Along with Chick-fil-A, this facility is also home to Tossed: Salads and Pizza. This 300-seat, 15,000-square-foot facility not only provides two delicious additional dining options for our students, but will also help free up congestion in our crowded dining hall, especially this year when social distancing is so critical. This facility also provides beautiful views overlooking Cedar Lake.

But more than just great food and a beautiful atmosphere, we are excited about the intentional discipleship that will take place within the walls of this building. D-groups will meet to discuss God's Word, encouraging each other to know Him more deeply. Faculty and staff will meet one-on-one with students to mentor them toward godly living. Students will enjoy meaningful conversations as they share a meal, building lifelong memories and friendships. Lives will be transformed over waffle fries and a Coke, and we will give God the glory for all that He accomplishes here.

In August, we celebrated the completion of the new 282-bed Bates-Dunn-Parker residence hall and dedicated it to God's glory. NEW CIVIL ENGINEERING CENTER



This fall, we opened the new Civil Engineering Center, home to the civil engineering major. This 20,806-square-foot facility houses two classrooms, nine laboratories, and five project labs, as well as six faculty offices. It is an inviting environment in which students can collaborate, study, and hone their knowledge. Civil engineers are game-changers for communities, offering strategic infrastructure solutions to support human flourishing, including good roads, sound bridges, clean water. Now, imagine taking that expertise to less-developed nations, combining engineering excellence with Christlike compassion to serve others and open doors for the Gospel. We currently have 64 civil engineering majors, many who have already expressed an interest in missions.

DONOR IMPACT IS GREATER THAN THE GAME



On October 6, Cedarville's Athletics Division held a "Greater Than the Game" giving day, with a goal of raising \$75,000 to support Yellow Jacket athletes. At Cedarville, Athletics is more than just the game; it's about athletes using their God-given talents to honor Him and bring others to Christ through interaction on the court, field, or track. All 16 varsity athletic programs, as well as cheerleading and athletic training, encouraged former team members, parents, and fans to participate. Always competitors, teams challenged each other to see which group could raise the most money. Women's basketball came in first with \$2,500, followed by women's soccer with \$1,500. By the end of the day, more than 300 donors had given \$132,500 toward Athletics. This support is critical to building a championship-caliber athletic program that emphasizes physical, mental, and spiritual growth.

2016 engineering graduates Jared and Lorrin Newman began their faithful and generous partnership with Cedarville University just one year following graduation.
