Callan Looks to 1980-81

The Yellow Jacket 1979-80 basketball team had an outstanding year culminating in a 21-9 season. It was a year full of success and excitement for fans and team members alike.

The Yellow Jacket Cagers lost two key starters to graduation. Rick Hickman's speed and Kim Kauffman's rebounding and scoring potential will be missed. However, the return of 10 of last year's top 12 and what Callan calls "the best recruiting year we have had", leads one to believe that an even higher level of success and excitement will carry through the historic gym's final year.

Senior NAIA All American Honorable Mention pick, Eric Mounts, and juniors

Drew Baker and Mark Womack are returning starters who will be looked to for a good

deal of the leadership for the twelve freshmen on this year's roster. "If you

consider bodies, we'll be in good shape," reports Callan.

There will be more competition within the squad for the top 12 positions than there has ever been before. Some of the freshmen are equal in raw talent to those who were on last year's team. Now the test will come to see if these rookies can jell with or fit into the synch of the Yellow Jacket style of play, to see how quickly they develop, and to see how they fit into our pattern and approach physically, mentally and spiritually.

Rich Himes, 6'8" and Tim Danube, 6'6", will be rookies vying for the position left vacant by Kauffman along with sophomore, Dave Carr. Carr has vastly improved over last year's rookie appearance. He is consistent, a hustler, and adds stability to the defense. Sophomore transfer Tim Pryor will also be seeking to take Kauffman's

slot but will not be eligible until December 12, 1980. Curt Berger will be a prime contender for Hickman's guard position. Curt hits the outside shot well, is a good ball handler, and a floor leader. However, he will receive a strong challenge from Malcolm Dixon when he becomes eligible December 12.

In pre-season scrimmages Callan has been generally pleased with the Yellow Jacket play. The team runs a consistent pattern, they are organized, and maintain a high level of intensity. The strength of the freshmen in size will be proved as they develop rapidly, but experience in college ball is needed for the rookies to be effective.

Dr. Don Callan, Head Coach

Dr. Don Callan, Athletic Director and head coach of the Yellow Jackets, is in his 21st season at Cedarville College. The past 20 years have been fruitful years. Dr. Callan's record now stands at 268-253. In 1963 and 64 he lead his 18-6 Yellow Jacket squad to the NAIA National Tournament, and his impressive 23-4 mark the following year included the Mid-Ohio Conference title. Two of the four losses in the 1964-65 season came to the NAIA National Champs. Dr. Callan was awarded the NAIA District 22 Coach of the Year title following that same season. Once again in 1968-69 Coach Callan lead the Yellow Jacket cagers to the Mid-Ohio Conference Championship and earned a birth in the NAIA District 22 play-offs.

More recently, head coach Don Callan was honored by his peers in the district as the NATA District 22 Coach of the Year. Callan, in his 20th season, guided the Yellow Jackets to a 21-9 record, their best in fifteen years. The Yellow Jackets finished as the best team of record in the district but took second behind Defiance College.

Dr. Callan's coaching career has not been limited to the sphere of Cedarville.

He has coached and lectured in Japan, Korea, Hong Kong, Philippines, New Guinea, and

Tailand. He worked with a national team in Australia and coached the Chinese Air

Force team in Taiwan.

Dr. Callan is also founder of the Missionary Internship Servic (MIS) at Cedarville College. Beginning with a trip to the Orient by the Athletes for Christ Basketball Team in 1971, the MIS program has now expanded to include approximately 100 students annually, traveling to nearly every corner of the globe. Whether it be the basketball team's annual trip to the Philippines, the soccer team's trip to the Ivory Coast, the

ministry of our musical teams to Australia or Brazil, or any of the other many MIS experiences; the impact of this program, founded by Dr. Callan, has been profound on Cedarville College students since its 1971 inception.

Dr. Callan is a 1955 graduate of Taylor University. He received his masters degree from Ball State Teachers College in 1960 and a Ph.D. in Physical Education from Ohio State University in 1968.

HIGHLIGHTS ON RETURNING STARTERS

DREW BAKER will take up a lot of the jumping and scoring slack left from Kauffman's absence. The 6'2" junior forward compensates for his lack of height under the basket with a strong leaping ability. Drew was last year's top rebounder, bringing down 168 defensive & 115 offensive rebounds. He also had the highest field goal percentage of 56.5 and was last year's third highest scorer totaling 405 points for a 14.0 points per game average.

Team captain, ERIC MOUNTS, will be returning for his final season and will in all probability become Cedarville College's all time leading scorer sometime during the course of the season. After only three years on the Yellow Jacket court, Eric is already the fourth leading scorer with 1,833 points to his credit. The school record was set by 1968 graduate Al Knot and stands at 2,056 points. Last year, Eric was the cagers leading scorer with 680 points for the season. He was also awarded the Mid-Ohio Conference Most Valuable Player, NATA All-American Honorable Mention, NCCAA All-American Second Team, NATA All-District 22 Team, Mid-Ohio All-Conference Team, and J. Albert Turner Award titles. Eric was also selected last spring to travel as one of twenty student/athletes to Australia with the NATA All-Stars.

Junior, MARK WOMACK, is a strong team player. He is consistent, intelligent, methodical and makes few mental or physical mistakes. Mark also brings a good deal of cohesiveness and organization to the club and the Yellow Jacket style of play.

Mark's 56.4 field goal percentage last year was second only to Baker's 56.5. The fact that a majority of the shots from this high percentage shoter comes from outside is key to the Yellow Jacket offense. With the additional punch added by Mounts and Berger, this year's offensive attack will be tough to beat from outside. Mark was last year's fourth leading scorer with 360 points, and held an 82.9 free throw percentage.

LAST SEASON'S RESULTS

The Cedarville College Yellow Jackets ended their most successful season since 1964-65, posting an impressive 21-9 mark for 1979-80. The Jackets made the NAIA District 22 finals for the first time since 1969 by defeating Malone College 92-91 in overtime, but were stopped in the final game by a tough Defiance College squad.

Reflecting upon the season, Cedarville's head coach Don Callan said he was "very, very pleased" with his team's performance. "We won a lot of games that should not have been ours. We were the smaller team almost every time we played, but we took the floor and played our hearts out." The caliber of the squad was something that made this year special for Callan in his twentieth season. "The guys on this team are not only good ballplayers, but they are quality young men. They have shown themselves to be mature in their attitudes, and demonstrated a spiritual depth that reflects their love for Jesus Christ."

Going into the season, most observers felt that Cedarville had a good team, but no one expected a 21-9 season. Even Coach Callan had said that he'd be happy, "if we can pull out 14 or 15 games." Then asked to explain his team's great season, he said, "I think a lot of our success came because our guys have really applied the team concept of basketball in their play. They have worked so well together, and still went out there doing what they do best."

Perhaps the greatest distingushing feature of this team was its spiritual unity. "Each member of this squad exhibited a tremendous sense of priorities. They showed their Christianity in their play and in their attitudes. They were intense players on the court, but never forgot that they were playing for their Lord."
