





Sangamon State is a liberal arts university with an enrollment of 3,650, offering students innovative as well as traditional academic programs. Established in 1969 as the first of two senior institutions, instruction begins at the junior year and continues through the graduate level.

As Illinois' Public Affairs University, SSU is mandated to educate people for public service and to provide government with qualified personnel. In fulfilling this mandate, SSU offers academic programs which prepare students for careers in the public sector. The University also addresses itself to a variety of government needs through research, special courses, projects and internships.

In addition, SSU is charged with fostering an active understanding of contemporary problems and public policy. This is accomplished through credit courses on current topics — Public Affairs Colloquia — and through an annual PAC Intersession. The Intersession regularly brings to campus nationally-known experts for an in-depth examination of important public issues.

SSU offers study in 22 graduate and 24 undergraduate major programs. Emphasis in all programs is on practical experience in conjunction

with classroom learning. That emphasis is embodied in the Applied Study Term, which places undergraduates in the workplace. At the graduate level, a number of internships in the public and private sectors are available to qualified students.

SSU's richly diverse faculty bring to the classroom a strong commitment to excellence in teaching, and they serve individual students as academic advisers. In addition, classes are generally small and informal. Students have exceptional opportunity to affect the direction and focus of their education.

The University's 740-acre main campus is located six miles southeast of Springfield, the state's capital city. The site contains the Norris L Brookens Library, apartment-style student housing, the Public Affairs Center (PAC) and other classroom and office facilities. The PAC houses the sophisticated 1,951-seat University Auditorium and an extensive conference center in addition to food services, classrooms and offices. SSU also operates a Capital Campus located four blocks from the Statehouse in downtown Springfield.





## National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a completely autonomous association, currently administering programs of intercollegiate athletics in 515 fully accredited four-year colleges and universities. The fundamental tenent of the NAIA is that intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the total educational program of the institution. This belief is strongly reflected in the governing documents, activities and organizational structure of the Association.

#### **PURPOSE AND HISTORY**

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball, the NAIA (the name change coming in 1952) emanated from a "National Small College Basketball Tournament" inaugurated in 1937 in Kansas City Missouri. The conversion of the NAIB to the NAIA in 1952 included the expansion of the program to include national championships in golf, outdoor track and field and tennis. Football (two divisions), cross country, baseball and swimming were added to the ledger in 1956 and wrestling (1958), soccer (1959), bowling (1962 - 1978), gymnastics (1964), indoor track and field (1966), ice hockey (1968) and volleyball (1969) are the most recent additions. The initial purpose of the NAIA — to provide national championship opportunities to colleges and universities competing below the so-called "major" level — has indeed been well served.

NAIA organizes and administers all areas of intercollegiate athletics at the national level, including rules and standards, and district and national sports competition.

The NAIA clearly outlines its own responsibilities and those of its members: a sound athletics program, administered and controlled by those responsible for the administration of the college. This means direct supervision in the matter of caliber of competition, financing of the athletics program, and taking steps to assure that financial assistance is made available only through the institution and under the same general policies as aid to all students. In short, the basic premise is that the athletics program must be a basic component of the overall general educational process within the institution, and not an entity apart.

The NAIA encourages a broad program of athletic pursuits in its member institutions, and making the program available to the greatest possible number of students. The national organization aims at uniformity and equity in policies and practices through its district and national tournaments and meetings.

Eligibility rules in the NAIA govern all play in all sports recognized by the Association, not just post-season tournaments, and must be adhered to by all members, including, members holding dual affiliation with other associations.

#### **HOW ADMINISTERED**

The principal governance body of the NAIA is the Execu-

tive Committee, composed of 11 persons elected by the membership, and the Executive Director (exofficio). This committee is responsible for establishing policies and determining the overall direction of the Association.

The NAIA is organized into 31 geographic districts spread over the 50 states and including one Canadian member. Each district is governed by a District Executive Committee, the chief officer of which is the District Chairman. Representation of the District Executive Committee includes one committeeman for each three active member schools, or major fraction thereof, in the district. The District Chairman is elected for a three-year term by a vote of the active membership within the District.

The District is the basic unit of the NAIA. The District Executive Committee establishes a program of District championship events in the various sports. Individual and team District championships are certified to compete in Area and/or National championship competitions by virtue of winning the District event or by meeting qualifying standards established within the particular sport.

Women's Division — Effective August, 1980, the NAIA instituted a championship event program for women through its newly-established Women's Division. Nine championships for women were offered during the 1980-81 sports season. The NAIA decision to offer competitive opportunities and championship events for women followed two years of consideration by the membership and proposals developed by a committee on women's athletics. The general membership passed the proposal by mail vote in May, 1980.

#### **MEMBERSHIP ELIGIBILITY**

Any four-year, degree-granting college or university in the United States and Canada, fully-accredited by the member accrediting agencies or commissions of the Council on Postsecondary Accreditation, may become an active member. Institutions may become members of the NAIA at any time but schools sending in membership dues after the deadline of October 15 will not be considered as active members and will not be eligible to participate in District, Area and National events until the next eligibility reporting deadline following payment of dues. Those reporting deadlines are: October 15, February 1 and April 15.

#### **OBLIGATION OF MEMBERSHIP**

Member institutions must conduct their intercollegiate athletic programs to the standards of the regulatory Association in which they hold memberships, and the NAIA. They must pay the annual membership dues and be in support of the policies of the Association. Where institutional rules and standards are stricter than those of the regulatory group or the NAIA, those rules and standards of the institution are recognized and supported by the NAIA

### 1980 NAIA Soccer Championships

Swedish-born freshman Tor Duner poked in a point-blank shot just 28 seconds into the first 10 minute overtime to give Quincy College, IL a 1-0 win over Simon Fraser University, CAN in the championship game of the 22nd annual NAIA National Soccer Tournament, November 29 at Sangamon State University, Springfield, IL.

The Victory marked an unprecedented fourth consecutive NAIA soccer title for the Hawks and their 10th national championship overall. Davis and Elkins College, WV defeated Alabama-Huntsville in the third place contest, 3-2, and Rockhurst College, MO was a 4-1 winner over Keene State College, NH in the fifth place consolation.

Davis and Elkins senior Mick Riordan was named the outstanding back of the tournament and Alabama-Huntsville's lan Harding received the outstanding forward award. Quincy's senior captain Mike Gallo was voted the most valuable player.

## WHAT IS THE BRINE FORMULA FOR BETTER SOCCER?



The air flow over a soccer ball and thus the lift and drag of the ball are dependent on whether the local boundary layer is laminar or turbulent, i.e. whether the flow is so-called subcritical, transcritical or supercritical.

The drag coefficient

$$\overline{C}d_0 = \frac{Drag}{\frac{\pi}{8} D^2 V^3}$$
, of a smooth ball in low turbulence

flow as a function of Reynolds number,  $R_d = \frac{\rho VD}{r}$ 


where D is the ball diameter,

p is the air density,

V is the speed of the ball with respect to the air, and  $\mu$  is the viscosity of air.


Below a Reynolds number of about  $2 \times 10^5$  (subcritical flow) the drag coefficient gradually reduces to an asymptotic value of about 0.47. From about  $R_d = 2 \times 10^5$  to  $6 \times 10^6$  (transcritical flow) the drag coefficient drops to about 0.15. Above  $R_d = 106$  the drag remains roughly constant, although it does begin to rise again at about  $R_d = 10^7$ . For a soccer ball the critical Reynolds number is exceeded at about 30 mph

It is important to note that both flow visualization and measurement of the surface pressures over a soccer ball has shown that the reason for the reduction in drag coefficient is that at the higher Reynolds numbers the air flow "adheres" to the surface of the sphere over a greater portion of the surface.

If one (lower) side of the ball is embossed and the other smooth then the flow is as shown below:



Such a flow shows that there will be "lift" force on the soccer ball in a direction away from the smooth side, i.e., the ball tends to curve. Further, if it were spinning slowly the soccer ball would appear to jump, i.e., have lift for a short while and then stop. This same effect is the objective of the knuckle ball pitchers use in baseball.

As already pointed out, both turbulence in the approaching air and the WIND CHANNEL on the surface of the BRINE soccer ball can reduce the critical Reynolds number. The air through which a typical soccer ball is kicked has little small scale turbulence and thus it is the WIND CHANNELING on the BRINE soccer ball that results in the decrease in critical Reynolds number.

Roughness, or embossing, on the order of  $K/D = 10^{-3}$  (where K is the embossing height and D the diameter of the ball) provides a significant reduction of the critical Reynolds number. The  $K/D = 10^{-3}$  embossing is less than the WIND CHANNELING on a BRINE soccer ball.
