State of the University Address - This Friday, October 2, at 10 a.m., Cedarville's President, Dr. Thomas White, will deliver the annual State of the University address, outdoors from the North Field stage. You can also watch via livestream or Facebook Live. Be sure to be a part of this always-exciting time as we celebrate God's faithfulness to Cedarville University, and this year, you won't want to miss an exciting announcement!

Caring Well Meals - As we told you last week, as part of the Caring Well Meals ministry, faculty and staff are volunteering to provide tasty, sufficient, and timely meals to students who are in quarantine or isolation due to COVID-19. Watch a video to learn more about this program that has already blessed many students.



Caring Well Encouragement - Would you like to offer encouragement or a prayer on behalf of Cedarville students who are either quarantined or isolated? Concerning COVID - We're continuing our Concerning COVID series, where senior nursing students, as part of their NSG-4000 Care of Populations course, investigate your COVID-related questions each week, researching each question and providing evidence-based answers.



Here's this week's question: Why are drinking fountains turned off as a protection against COVID-19? Find Answer

CU in Class - With COVID-19 limiting activities that our guests can experience while on campus, including sitting in on classes, we've come up with a way for prospective students and their families to experience life at Cedarvillle. Our CU in Class video project will give prospective students access to classes in every school and department, so they can get a taste for academics at Cedarville via recorded video or livestream. New classes are being added each week. Encourage high school students you know to check out CU in Class.

Rapid Antigen Testing - As announced in our Caring Well. Staying Well. COVID-19 Operating Plan, we have been waiting for the equipment to provide rapid antigen testing for COVID-19 with results available within 10-15 minutes. This past week, this equipment arrived at both University Medical Services and Cedar Care Village Pharmacy. We have a very limited number of testing kits at this time in both locations, and our medical providers will make the determination on when an antigen test may be ordered versus the more accurate PCR test. The rapid antigen test has a 74-94% accuracy rate; the standard test is more reliable.

- Cedar Care Village Pharmacy is offering the test to anyone who wants a test (as supplies allow). Symptomatic patients should call first
- for specific instructions. UMS has tests available for symptomatic students who are being cared for by a UMS practitioner.

and maintaining physical distance. Tickets can be purchased at the SSC information desk or by calling the box office at 937-766-7787. Ticket sales are limited to faculty, staff, students, and cast members' families.

Moving the SSC Grab+Go Location - The Grab+Go station currently in the SSC Event Rooms is being relocated back to the dining hall

entrance for easier access. The Event Rooms will still be available for overflow seating. However, today through Thursday, September 29

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, seating capacity will be limited for each show, and COVID protocols will be in place, including wearing masks

through October 1, the Event Rooms will be closed for all meals due to Trustee meetings being held in that location. Cardboard Canoe Race - Even though we are not able to host homecoming and parents weekend this year, the School of Engineering and Computer Science will still be holding the annual crowd-favorite cardboard canoe race. You can watch via livestream this Friday, October 2, from 3-5 p.m. on our website or Facebook Live. We are discouraging large crowds around the lake in order to maintain safe distancing, and there will be no sound system onsite for the race. Tune in online to watch as freshmen engineering students race across Cedar Lake in

canoes they designed and constructed using just cardboard and packaging tape. It's always a fun time! Thursday Night Live - This Thursday, October 1, there will be a Caring Well. Staying Well.-themed TNL. Meet at 7 p.m. at the North Field (outdoor chapel location) for an evening of information, encouragement, and great music. We'll hear from students who have gone through the isolation or quarantine process and learn ways to encourage students going through the process right now. See you there!

Rapid Antigen Testing - how does that help a student practically? As in if they are tested and it showed they had covid in the past, would it allow them to avoid any future quarantines that may come up in their dorm? And is there a cost via Cedarville or the pharmacy?

Rapid antigen testing is a faster, less accurate way to know if you currently have COVID-19. It is commonly known as a rapid test. Students who have tested positive for COVID-19 previously are exempt from having to quarantine for 90 days from the date of their positive test. Testing is free for students from UMS, but there is a cost at Cedar Care. The University does not have any guidelines for the antibody test.
