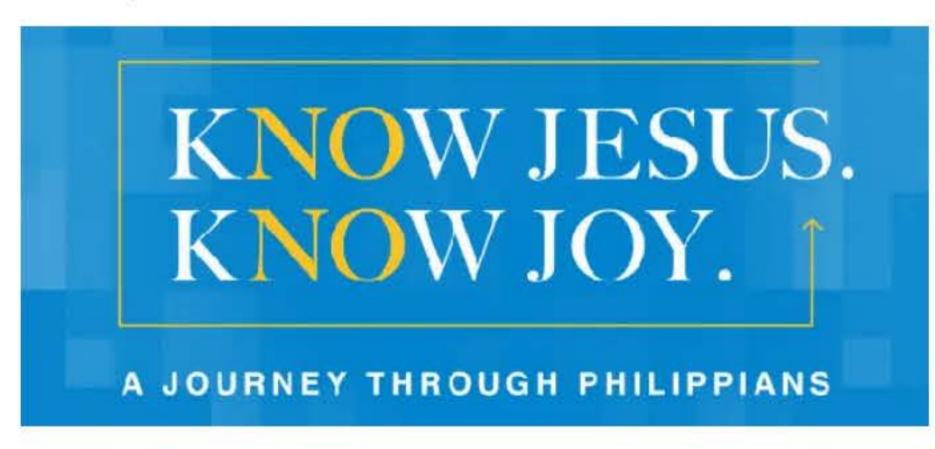
Great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised, and his greatness is unsearchable. (Psalm 145:3)

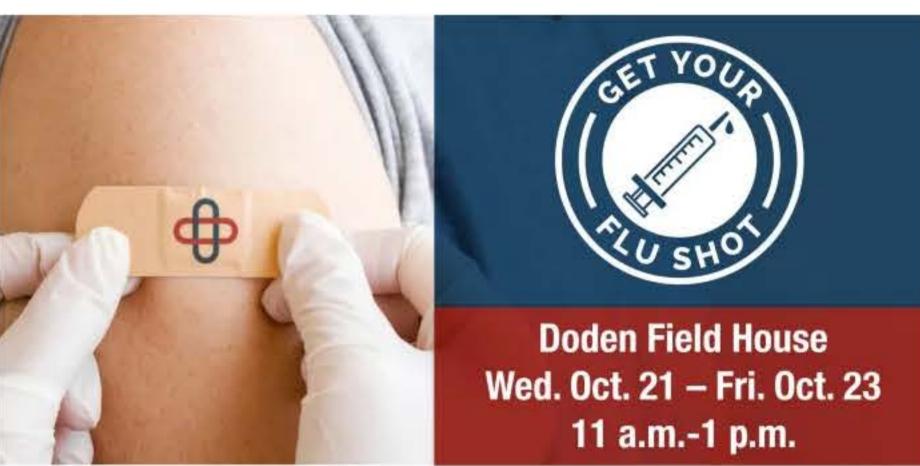


**Chapel Attendance Groups** – Starting this week, we have grouped residence halls into two groups for indoor chapel attendance. Students can find their group assignment online. Refer to the chapel schedule sent previously for days your group is to attend chapel in the Jeremiah Chapel. Off-campus, commuter, and grad students are welcome to pick any day they would like to attend.

**Cedar Care Flu Shot Clinics** – <u>Cedar Care Village Pharmacy</u> is continuing to provide opportunities for faculty, staff, and students to receive a flu shot. We are recommending flu shots as a way to limit infection and minimize isolations and quarantines as we care for students with symptoms.

- This Week's Flu Shot Clinic: October 21-23, 11 a.m.-1 p.m. in the south end of the Doden Field House
- Flu Shot Fridays: October 30 and November 6, 13, and 20 from 1-3 p.m. in the south end of the Doden Field House.
- Cedar Care Village Pharmacy downtown at any time. It's "Beans-N-Vaccines" at Cedar Care thru November! Stop in for a flu shot and get a BOGO 50% off coupon to Beans-n-Cream.

If you would like to use your health insurance, <u>preregister</u> at least 24 hours in advance. Students who will be paying out-of-pocket can have the \$30 charge direct billed to their student account and can just walk in to either the pharmacy or one of the flu shot clinics to get their shot. Cedar Care would be glad to schedule a time to vaccinate groups all at the same time, too (e.g., an athletic team, campus department, or a student org).
