It's no *Moby Dick*, but Julie Fogliano's little book is a charming how-to guide for whale-finding in its own right. If you want to see a whale, you will need plenty of time to wait and wait, and plenty of patience not to be distracted by anything that isn't a whale. Fogliano's gently lyrical prose, striking for its lack of sentence breaks and capital letters, is paired with Erin E. Stead's quiet prints of a boy and his beagle, adding life to the story.
