2005 NAIA National Players of the Week**NAIA Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Players of the Week
February 22, 2005**

Cameron Fitch of **Berry College (Ga.)** has been named the NAIA Division I Men's Basketball Player of the Week and **Stacey Northern** of **Southern University at New Orleans (La.)** has been named the NAIA Division I Women's Basketball Player of the Week for the week ending February 20, 2005.

Fitch, a 6-foot-1-inch senior guard from Acworth, Ga., moved into first place on Berry's all-time scoring list with 24 points in an 85-69 victory against Faulkner University (Ala.). He added seven rebounds and two assists in the game. Fitch's 28 point, four rebound and five assist performance in a 96-77 victory against Lee University (Tenn.) made him only the second player in school history to reach the 500 career assists plateau. The Vikings are 19-10 overall.

Northern, a 5-foot-9-inch senior forward from Baton Rouge, La., recorded 26 points, eight rebounds and five steals in Southern-New Orleans' 44-68 loss to then No. 11 Xavier University (La.). The team rebounded, winning its next two games at home. Northern recorded 37 points, four rebounds and four steals in a 70-59 victory against William Carey College (Miss.). She added 17 points and seven rebounds against Dillard University (La.), who had received votes in the ratings that week. The Lady Knights are 13-7 overall.

**NAIA Division II Men's and Women's Basketball Players of the Week
February 22, 2005**

Andy Ketelsen of **Midland Lutheran College (Neb.)** has been named the NAIA Division II Men's Basketball Player of the Week and **Kari Flunker** of **Cedarville University (Ohio)** has been named the NAIA Division II Women's Basketball Player of the Week for the week ending February 20, 2005.

Ketelsen, a 6-foot-2-inch senior guard from Osmond, Neb., recorded 25 points and three rebounds in an 89-86 road victory against Hastings College (Neb.). He added 41 points, five rebounds and two steals in 118-124 loss to Johnson and Wales University (Colo.). Ketelsen averaged 67 percent field goal shooting, 91 percent from the free throw line, 63 percent from the beyond the arc for the week. The Warriors are 6-23 overall.

Flunker, a 5-foot-7-inch senior guard from Florence, Wis., helped Cedarville to two road victories on the week. In an 81-65 victory against Tiffin University (Ohio), Flunker recorded a near double-double with 25 points and nine rebounds. She added four rebounds and two steals in the game. In a 93-70 victory against Malone College (Ohio), Flunker recorded 27 points, three rebounds, five assists and four steals. She set a school record in going 5-for-5 from 3-point range against Malone, and needs just 44 more points to become Cedarville's all-time leading scorer (2,186). The Yellow Jackets are 30-1 overall and the top team in the NAIA Division II Women's Basketball National Rating.
