LIBRARY COMPUTER CLASSROOM AVAILABLE

A new computer classroom, connected to the CedarNet, has been established in the Library. The room, previously Media Classroom 032, seats 32 with 16 student computers and an instructor's computer station with a large screen computer monitor for display. The use of the classroom is available on a reservation basis through the Library AV Services (7853). All uses of the classroom must be scheduled in advance. The intent behind the new computer classroom is to provide a computer facility for classes which need occasional access to computer software on the network for special demonstrations. Some training workshops are likely to be scheduled in the facility as well.

CEDARNET LIBRARY RESOURCES

Some additional Library resources have recently been added to the Library resources menus on CedarNet. Most are available through the DOS menu; some are available only under the Library icon in WINDOWS.

SELECTPHONE (ProPhone) - a national telephone directory of 80 million residential and business white pages listings. This title may be accessed through either the DOS or WINDOWS menus.

MAPLINX LITE - allows for the viewing of ProPhone data on a U.S. map with the ability to zoom into areas down to the city or county boundaries for greater map detail. Available under the Library WINDOWS icon only.

CHRONICLE GUIDE TO GRANTS - prepared by the Chronicle of Higher Education, allowing the retrieval of data on grant makers, recipients, grant descriptions, grant amounts, and by city, state, or county. Select the Library resources (on campus) DOS menu and then the "Catalogs/Directories/Handbooks" sub-menu.

ACADEMIC AMERICAN ENCYCLOPEDIA - all 21 volumes of the encyclopedia in multi-media format are available, including pictures and maps.

MULTI-MEDIA ENCYCLOPEDIA OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY - available under the Library icon in WINDOWS. Once you have accessed the encyclopedia, click on "databases" to select the encyclopedia text, the dictionary, biographies, study guides, maps, sky maps, or illustrations.

AKERSMART TUTORIALS - to access select the "Software tutorials" under the Library resources (on campus) DOS menu. Tutorials for learning and reviewing software, computer languages, and selected subject areas are included. Includes tutorials on the following:

USER EDUCATION PROGRAM

A reminder that the Library User Education "blueprint" program is now available. Four ready-made assignments (or "blueprints") requiring library use are offered for adaptation to a variety of courses. Since students more readily learn skills of information use when they have a specific information need, these "blueprints" are designed with that concept in mind. Each "blueprint" has an objective with an appropriate assignment for principle application. The basic "blueprints" available are as follows:

- 1. Objective: To expose the students to core journals in the discipline.
- 2. Objective: To expose the students to the effective use of the Library catalog and print/electronic indexes.
- 3. Objective: To expose the students to experts in the discipline.
- 4. Objective: To expose the students to the process of constructing a relevant search strategy for on-line database

searching.
