TESTING OF NEW PERIODICAL INDEXES ON THE INTERNET

The Library is investigating the periodical indexes listed below and full-text periodicals via the Internet for broader coverage of subjects, indexing, and quicker turn around for receiving current indexing data. Presently, we receive General Periodical Index, National Newspaper Index, and Company Profiles through CD-ROM technology. By adding these databases we would be adding more electronic access to indexing of our currently received periodical subscriptions. Since the databases are updated daily via Internet we also would gain more current indexing. Our main concern is the speed and consistency of the delivery through the Internet.

Within the DOS Menu you may try out a test version of these databases. The following are the steps to telnetting to these databases: 1) Communications Menu, 2) telnet, 3) type in the address cedar, 4) when it asks for LOGIN: type in the word access 5) the PASSWORD: type goodjob. You then should be connected to Information Access Databases and should read the screen for instructions. You will notice some of the commands are different than the present databases. After you have tried these databases we would like comments from you. Please send your comments or questions to the e-mail address: Library. Thank you for participating.
